EXAMINATION AT HOSPITAL

Three New Pupil Nurses Attained the Necessary Average and Will Begin Their Studies at Once—Donations During the Month of July.

Yesterday afternoon examinations were made at the Allentown Hospital for the purpose of ascertaining the qualifications of six young women who desired to become pupil nurses at that institution. The examination was conducted by Drs. W. H. Hartzell and J. D. Schaeffer. The averages required to pass were attained by Misses Florence Hartman and Bessie Scanlin, of Allentown, and Miss Catharine F. Coyle, of South Bethlehem. They will begin their studies this week. The selections were made entirely on the merits of the applicants. The class for this year will have five pupils. One passed the examination several weeks ago and the remaining pupil remains to be chosen.
