Memorial Day Observance

LYHN has scheduled two special events in honor of fallen veterans of military service on Wednesday, May 24.

MEMORIAL DAY OBSERVANCE – The fifth annual Memorial Day Observance will be held live at the LVH–Cedar Crest auditorium from noon to 12:20 p.m. It will be simulcast to locations throughout LVHN including LVH–Hazleton's Education Training Center (third floor).

An LVHN colleague who served in the U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, U.S. Marines, U.S. Air Force and U.S. Coast Guard will join in the annual flag bearing ceremony honoring the flags of the respective services. Lawrence Riddles, MD, LVH–Schuylkill Senior Medical Director and retired U.S. Air Force veteran, will bear the American flag in the ceremony.

Colleagues will also represent the respective services in the Laying of the Wreath on the Memorial Table ceremony in honor of the fallen.

All colleagues who are veterans are invited to wear their uniforms to work on May 24.

Refreshments will be served after the event in the School of Nursing's first floor auditorium. 


