CDIF - Know the Signs

A multi-disciplinary task force has been convened to address the growing problem with *Clostridium difficle* (*C.diff*).

C.difficile is a bacterium that can cause diarrhea and other serious intestinal problems.

Key risk factors include:

- Current or recent antibiotic use
- Advanced age
- Severe underlying illness or weakened immune system
- Current or recent stay in health-care setting
- Living in a nursing home or long-term care facility
- Recent gastrointestinal surgery
- Current use of a nasogastric tube
- Previous C.diff infection

How *C.diff* is spread:

- The fecal-oral route
- The hands of health-care workers
- "High-touch" surfaces and patient-care items

Know the signs of infection:

Mild

- occasional watery diarrhea
- mild abdominal pain or cramping

Moderate

- frequent watery diarrhea (may be foul-smelling)
- moderate abdominal pain or cramping
- fever
- nausea and loss of appetite

Severe

- blood and/or pus in frequent watery diarrhea (may be foul-smelling)
- severe abdominal pain or cramping
- *These are signs of an inflamed colon. These patients are at high risk for dangerous complications such as ruptured colon and blood poisoning.

Clean and disinfect "high-touch" items and patient-care equipment carefully with Dispatch or Virasept.

Prevent the spread of *C.diff* by doing the following:

- Place infected patients in single rooms or cohort patients
- Wear, replace, and dispose of PPE between each patient

Proper and frequent hand washing is key! Remember...alcohol-based hand sanitizers do not kill *C.diff* bacteria. You must use soap and water.
