LVH-Hazleton Earns Heart Failure Achievement Award


Lehigh Valley Hospital-Hazleton (LVH-Hazleton) has received the Get With The Guidelines®-Heart Failure Gold Plus Quality Achievement Award for implementing specific quality improvement measures outlined by the American Heart Association/American College of Cardiology Foundation's secondary prevention guidelines for patients with heart failure.

This marks the ninth consecutive year that LVH–Hazleton has been recognized with this quality achievement award.

Get With The Guidelines-Heart Failure is a quality improvement program that helps hospital teams follow the most up-to-date, research-based standards with the goal of speeding recovery and reducing hospital readmissions for heart failure patients. Launched in 2005, numerous published studies have demonstrated the program's success in achieving patient outcome improvements, including reductions in 30-day readmissions.

LVH-Hazleton earned this award by meeting specific quality achievement measures for the diagnosis and treatment of heart failure patients. These measures include evaluation of the patient, proper use of medications and aggressive risk-reduction therapies, such as ACE inhibitors/ARBs, beta-blockers, diuretics, anticoagulants, and other appropriate therapies. Before patients are discharged, they also receive education on managing their heart failure and overall health, schedule a follow-up visit, as well as other care transition interventions.

LVH-Hazleton also received the association's Target: Heart FailureSM Honor Roll for the fifth consecutive year. Target: Heart Failure is an initiative that provides hospitals with

It's the question on everyone's mind: If a new health care bill becomes law, will it impact LVHN? The answer: Yes, it will. It unquestionably matters to us if the Affordable Care Act – commonly referred to as ObamaCare – is repealed. Additionally, the details of the law that replaces the Affordable Care Act will significantly impact our health network. That is why I recently visited Washington D.C. to talk with members of Congress about how hospitals and health systems will be affected by their decisions.

As a new bill is crafted, our hope is that "shared responsibility" remains so that people have equivalent or increased coverage. That's why it's imperative that a new health care plan is developed in a thoughtful and cooperative manner with all stakeholders at the table.

If you've been following the news, you know that a new bill – called the American Health Care Act – passed the House and was to be sent to the Senate. While I cannot yet tell you what or when changes to the bill will be proposed, I can ensure you we will continue to be advocates for the people of our community. I – along with colleagues from our Office of Government Affairs – welcome the opportunity to talk with our elected officials and to be part of the process to create a sensible health care plan that gives people access to primary care and the other services they need to live a healthy life.

I will continue to keep you updated and explain how proposed changes will affect us. Regardless of what happens in Washington, at LVHN, providing better health and better care at a better cost will always be our aim. Thank you for all you do to make it happen every day. I'll talk with you next month.
