### NATIONAL HOSPITAL WEEK

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### CENTER'S CHEMIST CERTIFIED

<u>DR. GERALD CLEMENT</u>, clinical chemist in the Hospital Center Laboratory, has received notification that he passed the examination for certification by the American Association of Clinical Chemists.

Dr. Clement is a graduate of the University of Minnesota and received his doctorate from Purdue University in 1961. He did a two year post-doctoral fellowship with Professor Myron Bender. Dr. Clement was associate professor of Bio Chemistry at the State University of New York and professor of Bio Chemistry at Kenyon College in Gambier, Ohio. He then returned to two additional years of post-doctoral fellowship in clinical bio-chemistry with Dr. Dirck Vloedman.

Dr. Clement has published, as senior author, a total of seventeen papers and is a recognized authority on the mechanism of action of pepsin and renin.

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### STATE WIDE AUXILIARY MEETS AT CENTER

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### ELECTRIC POWER TO BE INTERRUPTED

ON THURSDAY, MAY 22ND, beginning at about 2 pm, adjustments will be made to the Hospital Center's electric power service. In critical areas, alternate electrical service will take over and the emergency generator will be operating to provide additional service. However, certain areas will not have power during the period of adjustment.

For an approximate one hour period, the use of elevators will be limited as only one will be operating for emergency purposes only and be under the control of an attendant. Non-essential movement should be relegated to the stairwells. Departments should make plans for coping with this power outage. The duration of the outage is expected to be one hour and a rain date has been established for Friday, May 23rd, also at 2 pm.

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### MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP

FORTY-FOUR MEMBERS OF THE HOSPITAL CENTER'S MANAGEMENT TEAM participated in a nine hour Management Development Workshop conducted by Penn State University. The workshop, which was spread over a three day period, covered such topics as Time Management, The Essence of Supervision, Decision Making, and an Introduction to Management by Objectives. Samuel DeWald, of the Pennsylvania State University Management Development Faculty, conducted the workshop.
