On June 30, an LVHN colleague was assaulted while working in LVH–Muhlenberg's emergency department. The colleague is recovering from his injuries. It was an isolated incident, and the Bethlehem Police have arrested the suspect. In light of this incident, LVHN's Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer sends this message to colleagues.

Your Safety Means Everything at LVHN

On behalf of LVHN, I'd like to express our heartfelt thanks to the entire staff at the LVH–Muhlenberg emergency department (ED) – including physicians, clinical staff, psychiatric evaluation service, public safety, emergency management, leadership ... and countless other colleagues who came to offer their support – for their quick response and intervention in this unfortunate situation.

I want every colleague to be assured that the safety of each LVHN colleague, patient and visitor is the primary concern at all times for all of us at our health network. We seem to live in a time where the unthinkable occurs more often around the world than we could ever expect. Please remember we are family here at LVHN. Health care is more than a job. We are committed

to our patients and to each other.

Since this incident occurred, many suggestions have been brought to our attention by concerned colleagues, and we appreciate their feedback. We will review all suggestions in our efforts to enact short- and long-term changes that will enhance the security standards at all of our EDs.

I can tell you additional security will be patrolling the LVH–Muhlenberg campus throughout this week and beyond. But we also ask for your help in our efforts to prevent the unthinkable. If at any time you encounter something or someone who is concerning or suspicious, please contact security immediately and report it. Don't hesitate. The safety of our colleagues, patients and visitors may depend on it.

I ask every colleague to maintain

"situational awareness," which means simply knowing what is happening around you. For example, when entering a locked, secure area, make sure no one is walking in right behind you. It's one of those things that you may not give a second thought during the course of a busy work shift. We're human. But all of us need to make the effort, to try to give it that second thought. Again, you may make a real difference.

You all do wonderful work every day, and we value every person that wears an LVHN badge. We're here for you and we know you are here for our community. As always, thank you for all you do for LVHN.
