### HealthEast Employee Health Plan

As of January 1, HealthEast will replace Prudential as the hospitals' benefits administrator. All claims will now be processed by Spectrum Administrators, 50 College Drive, Cedar Crest College, Allentown. Under the **HealthEast Employee Health Plan**, employees will enjoy the same comprehensive benefits as in the past. However, it will now be easier to file and receive payment on claims, according to Thomas G. Seabourne, HealthEast Human Resources senior vice president.

HealthEast became self-insured several years ago in the interest of cost containment. Beginning in January, HealthEast will remain self-insured but it will no longer be necessary to pay claims through Prudential.

New identification insurance cards will be issued to each employee. New claim forms will also be available when submitting a bill, and can be picked up from Personnel. For more information contact the Personnel Office at extension 2279.
