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# LVH/MHC Medical Staff Reappointment

In compliance with the regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Health, the Medical Staff and Hospital Bylaws, and the standards of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, each member of the hospital's Medical Staff must be reappointed a minimum of once every two years.

On March 2, this year's reappointment process will be put into motion when Reappointment Packets will be mailed to over 1,000 members of the Medical Staff. Each packet will contain a five-page Application for Reappointment to the Medical Staff, a copy of the addressee's current privilege sheet, an insurance participation form, a malpractice claims report, a self-addressed return envelope, and to simplify the process, a Checklist has been included to assist in completing the information.

Although much of the information on the application is preprinted for each physician, it is of paramount importance that ALL the information be reviewed, changes made where necessary, and missing data completed. Before returning the application, please take a moment to review the Checklist to make sure all the information is complete and all the required documents have been attached to the application.

Your prompt attention to this matter is both requested and appreciated.

# MHC Cancer Services Fully Operational

Lehigh Valley Hospital and Health Network is pleased to announce that the new LVHHN Cancer Services at Muhlenberg Hospital Center (MHC) has become fully operational as of November 1. This beautiful new facility, located on the first floor of MHC's Kolb Ambulatory Center, has been providing oncology services since August 1999. With the recent addition and successful state inspection of the linear accelerator, the final phase of adding radiation therapy, including consultation and treatment, is complete. Patients can now receive the full scope of cancer services on the MHC Campus.

Services offered in the outpatient infusion and treatment areas include:

Radiation Therapy Chemotherapy Blood products Bone Marrow biopsy/aspiration IV Infusions Therapeutic Phlebotomy

The department is also approved for clinical trials and has tumor registry and social work services on site. Any additional services necessary can be obtained through the John and Dorothy Morgan Cancer Center at Lehigh Valley Hospital.

# MHC Central Scheduling Hours

Effective February 5, the Central Scheduling Department at Muhlenberg Hospital Center will no longer be staffed on Saturdays. This change was based on data collected over a four-month period that showed a very small volume of calls being made to this area on Saturdays. The Central Scheduling Department will be open Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Any STAT tests required for patients on Saturday or Sunday should be scheduled directly with the department.

### Breast Cancer Prevention Study

Lehigh Valley Hospital's John and Dorothy Morgan Cancer Center is participating in one of the largest breast cancer prevention studies ever, joining more than 400 other medical centers in the United States, Canada and Puerto Rico.

The Morgan Cancer Center, which is also operating the Study of Tamoxifen and Raloxifene (STAR) at Muhlenberg Hospital Center, Gnaden Huetten Memorial Hospital, and Hazleton General Hospital, is looking for women to join the study.

STAR will examine whether the osteoporosis drug raloxifene is effective in preventing breast cancer in women who are at high risk for the disease and whether it offers benefits over tamoxifen, the drug of choice. In the first Breast Cancer Prevention Trial, in which the Morgan Cancer Center also participated, tamoxifen showed a reduced chance of developing breast cancer by about half.

"Studies of raloxifene suggest it has the potential to prevent breast cancer," said Elisabeth Ladd, director of Breast Health Services. "The only way to prove that potential is to do a clinical trial in which the risks and benefits of raloxifene are directly compared with the risks and benefits of tamoxifen."

Women who participate must be postmenopausal, at least age 35, and have had an increased risk of breast cancer determined by their family history of breast cancer, personal medical history, age at first menstrual period and age at first live birth.

Once a woman chooses to participate, she will be randomly assigned to either 20 mg tamoxifen or 60 mg raloxifene daily for five years and will have regular follow-up examinations, including mammograms and gynecologic exams.

Up to 22,000 women nationwide are expected to be enrolled in this double-blind, randomized clinical trial.

# Clinical Trial for Depression

As part of a national study, Lehigh Valley Hospital is currently enrolling adults with symptoms of depression in a clinical trial for an investigational drug. Enrollees receive a free depression screening and medical evaluation. After the screening and evaluation, if qualified, the participant will receive the drug and study-related medical attention for one year. There is no placebo. Participants must be medically stable otherwise. Laurence P. Karper, MD, Medical Director, Behavioral Health Emergency Services, is the principle investigator for the study. The above sessions will feature coding/audit practice and will focus on E & M codes.
