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DONATIONS BY CHILDREN.

Responded Most Liberally to the Call
From the Allentown Hospital.

The school children of Allentown yesterday responded most liberally in their donations to the Allentown Hospital. The donations in provisions will easily double those of last year and the cash amounts are also expected to exceed those of last year.

The fire companies started on their tours of collection at 2.30 and 3.30 yesterday afternoon. The janitors of the various buildings had packed the articles in barrels and boxes and thus they were easily handled. They were all taken to a basement room in the hospital and the same was well filled. Among the articles noticed were:

Oatmeal, canned cherries, canned pears, peaches, jelly, sand soap, potatoes, boraxine, baking powder, apple butter, sugar, plums, soap, apples, soda, turnips, cabbages, cocoa, bread, canned peas, dried apples, bottles of catsup, matches, canned beans, buckwheat, flour, cornstarch, crackers, canned goods, rice, radishes, oranges, cranberries, prepared foods, preserves, etc.

Last year the cash donations amounted to \$403.70.

The Pioneer firemen took two wagon loads of provisions from the Tenth Ward and Washington buildings and through the courtesy of Dr. C. S. Martin inspected the hospital.

The donation of the children reminded some of the older people of their duties. The Art Store sent a handsome picture and George H. Klepinger sent a nice lot of groceries.
