The total amount of money contributed by the various schools throughout the city last Wednesday for the hospital is \$376.76. This is \$27.21 less than was contributed last year, when the total amount contributed was \$403.97. The amount of provisions contributed this year, calculated on a cash basis, amounts to \$228.33, which is far superior to that of last year and more than makes up the difference between the cash contributions of this year and last.

The following are the amounts contributed: First Ward, \$36.19; Second Ward, \$37.12; Third Ward, \$29.01; Lincoln school building, \$18.67; Fourth Ward, \$28.56; High School, \$45.15; Sixth Ward, \$27.77; Seventh Ward, \$37.84; Eighth Ward, \$22.76; Washington school building, \$9.81; Ninth Ward,

\$36.78; Tenth Ward, \$26.35; Allen school building, \$7.48; Eleventh Ward, \$13.27.

The denominations of the money are as follows: Pennies, 4,756; nickels, 2,080; dimes, 847; quarters, 262; fifty cent pieces, 38; one dollar bills, 34; two dollar bills, 6; five dollar bills, 2.
