

INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION POLICY

A Message from Ronald W. Swinfard, MD, President and CEO; Thomas V. Whalen, MD, Chief Medical Officer, and Michael J. Pistoria, DO, Medical Staff President

The safety of our patients and colleagues is our number one priority. With this in mind, Lehigh Valley Health Network is introducing a phased approach to a policy that requires all colleagues — employees, medical and allied health professional staff, residents, students/trainees, volunteers and contracted personnel — to receive a flu vaccination as a condition of employment, exempting vaccination for only those who have valid medical or religious reasons. The Medical Executive Committee approved this policy at its meeting on August 2, 2011.


Beginning on September 15, 2011, colleagues will be strongly encouraged – but not required – to receive a flu vaccination. Those who decline an immunization will be required to submit a formal declination, with a reason for the declination by December 1, 2011. Those who decline and are designated as having patient contact will be required to wear a surgical mask or particulate respirator during flu season. If a colleague refuses to wear a mask, there will be a formal corrective action process that can result in termination after three occurrences.

Beginning September 15, 2012, we will implement phase II of the policy. At that time, colleagues who have patient contact will be required to receive the vaccine annually as a condition of employment, unless exempt for medical or religious reasons.

Here's how the policy will work:

- All colleagues listed above should be immunized against influenza each year unless they have a valid medical or bonafide religious reason not to be vaccinated.
- Personnel who decline the vaccine for valid medical or bonafide religious reasons are required to submit a declination by December 1, 2011.
- Personnel who decline vaccination and who have patient contact are required to wear a surgical mask or particulate respirator when within six feet of a patient or when they enter a patient area.
- Failure to comply with the immunization policy by December 1, 2011, will result in a written warning. If an individual is not vaccinated and has not submitted a declination with a reason for declining within two weeks of the warning, the following action will be taken:
 - O Medical and allied health professional staff will have their privileges temporarily suspended and will have them restored only upon submission of proof of vaccination or submitted declination.
 - O All other staff will be temporarily removed from the schedule and not permitted to work until they have been vaccinated or have submitted a declination. This will be recorded as an unpaid, unscheduled and unplanned absence and counted as an occurrence under the attendance policy.

Beginning next flu season (September, 2012), all LVHN employees, medical and allied health professional staff, volunteers, and other staff who have patient contact



will be required to receive a flu vaccination. Failure to comply with the immunization policy will result in a written warning. All medical and allied health professional staff and other staff with patient contact who are not vaccinated or granted an exemption within two weeks of the warning, will be subject to termination. All other staff who do not have patient contact and are not vaccinated or have not submitted a declination within two weeks of warning, will be subject to termination.

For your information, the Influenza Immunization policy may be found in its entirety on the intranet. From the LVHN homepage, select **Departments – Non-Clinical – Human Resources – Policies** and click on "Administration of Influenza Vaccine for LVHN Health Care Personnel."

Free vaccinations will be offered at Employee Health Services at the Cedar Crest and Muhlenberg campuses beginning September 15 during walk-in hours and at employee forums from October through December. In addition, two flu vaccine clinics have been scheduled for members of the Medical Staff as follows:

- ➤ In conjunction with the General Medical Staff meeting – Monday, September 12, 5:30 to 6:30 p.m., lobby of Kasych ECC Rooms 7 and 8 at LVH-Cedar Crest and lobby of ECC Rooms C and D at LVH-Muhlenberg
- In conjunction with the GLVIPA Quarterly Membership meeting – Tuesday, October 18, 5:15 to 6:15 p.m., Auditorium at LVH-Cedar Crest

Updating Allergies in CE


All providers are aware of the potential risks of entering orders on a patient without all of the necessary information, such as weight, renal function or current medications. Allergies represent a critical piece of information that must be current, prior to entering medication orders.

Beginning later in September, a patient's allergy profile will require review or update before orders can be entered in Centricity Enterprise. If the patient's allergies have not been marked as reviewed or updated (including, "No Known Allergies" or "Unknown (Update Required)") within the previous 30 days, the "Add Orders" button on the Order Profile screen will be replaced by an "Add Allergies" button. The "Add Allergies" button will take you to the Allergy update screen. On this screen, you can review the existing allergy profile (click the "Mark as Reviewed"), or add to/modify the existing allergy profile, or click the "No Known Allergies" button. When this is completed, click the "Done" button. This will return you to the Order Profile screen and the "Add Orders" button will be available.

Both the Emergency Department and the Trauma Team have developed processes to support this change for their unique situations. Patients who are being electively admitted from a physician office can have their Allergy information updated at that time.

You can review the procedure for reviewing, modifying, or adding allergies by clicking on the "Resources" link on the Vertical Toolbar on the left side of the CE screen. The Physician Resources page has a link for "CE eLearning," which includes a short module regarding Allergies.

News from Health Information Management

In June, 2011, Lehigh Valley Hospital—Cedar Crest participated in an unannounced two-day survey by The Joint Commission. Several documentation opportunities were identified during the survey which require corrective action.

History and Physical – an adequate patient history and physical is recorded into the medical record before an operative or high risk procedure is performed.

- History and physical examinations shall be performed and documented by a credentialed member of the Medical, Allied Health or Resident staff.
- ➤ Histories and physicals may be performed up to 30 days prior to admission or a scheduled outpatient procedure. Upon admission, registration, or prior to surgery or a procedure requiring anesthesia services, a member of the Medical, Allied Health or Resident staff must perform another examination to update any component(s) of the patient's medical status.
- Histories and physicals must minimally include the following elements:

Inpatient Setting

- O Date of Examination
- Chief Compliant
- O History of Present Illness
- O Past medical/surgical history (include co-morbid conditions)
- Medications
- Allergies/reactions
- Physical examination to include general examination and detailed examination of the affected part
- O Impression
- O Diagnosis(es)
- Plan of Care

Ambulatory Outpatient Setting

- O Date of Examination
- Chief Compliant
- O History of Present Illness
- O Past medical/surgical history (include co-morbid conditions)
- O Medications
- O Allergies/reactions
- Physical examination to include general examination and detailed examination of the affected part
- O Impression
- O Diagnosis(es)
- O Planned Procedure Date

Best Practice: Dictate histories and physicals or utilize hospital forms for handwritten documentation (Inpatient – MRD-03 or Ambulatory/Outpatient MRD – 60)

Operative Report — A brief operative report will be entered into the medical record immediately following the procedure to include procedure, post-operative diagnosis, estimated blood loss, and pertinent findings. A separate, complete dictated operative report will be performed within 24 hours of the operation.

Required data elements for dictated operative reports include:

- Date of Procedure
- Surgeon and Assistants
- Procedures(s) Performed
- Description of Procedure(s)
- > Findings of Procedure(s)
- Estimated Blood Loss
- Specimen(s) Removed
- Post-op Diagnosis

Best Practice: Before leaving the Operating Room, write a brief OP note (procedure, post-op diagnosis, estimated blood loss and pertinent findings) and dictate a full operative report within 24 hours of the procedure.

Dating/Timing of Entries – All entries in the medical record must be dated and timed.

- Electronic documentation automatically assigns a date and time to entries.
- Paper documentation requires manual entry of date and time. All forms (progress notes, consents, etc.) have prompts for date and time and should be filled out in entirety.

Best Practice: Every time you manually sign your name in the medical record, include the date and time.

Verbal Orders – Qualified staff receive and record verbal orders with authentication within the time frame specified by law and regulation. Pennsylvania Department of Health requires verbal orders to be authenticated within 24 hours.

Upon accessing CAPOE (Computer Assisted Physician Order Entry), providers are immediately prompted for any unsigned orders in the Centricity Enterprise inbox for verbal/telephone and co-sign orders.

Best Practice: Review and authenticate orders on a daily basis. Develop a group protocol of assigning the responsibility for co-signing physician orders to a physician who is covering the hospital if the supervising physician is not available.

Unacceptable Abbreviations – The following abbreviations, acronyms and symbols should not be used in medical records on orders or medication-related documentation (handwritten, preprinted forms and computer entry).

The use of cell phone texting abbreviations are unacceptable forms of abbreviations and may not be used in the medical record.

Best Practice: Do not use unacceptable abbreviations or texting shortcuts in medical record documentation.

CLINICAL DOCUMENTATION IMPROVEMENT

Ever Wonder How the Attending Physician is Assigned to an Admission?

While you may know that the attending physician is the clinician of record who is primarily responsible for care of the patient, you might not know that:

- the physician who enters the discharge order in CAPOE selects the attending of record for that entire admission.
- in cases where an attending physician was not selected in CAPOE, Health Information Management (HIM) staff will then select the attending of record utilizing the following criteria:
 - O If the discharge summary is present at the time of chart analysis by the HIM Department, the physician who dictated the discharge summary will be chosen as the attending for the admission.
 - O If the discharge summary has not been dictated, the physician who wrote the discharge progress note or discharge order will be selected as the attending of record.

- O If the discharge progress note/order is completed by a resident, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner, the supervising physician is selected as the attending for the admission.
- O In cases of surgery performed in the operating room, the surgeon will be selected as the attending for the encounter.

The Center provides sleep testing services for children ages 1-17 including diagnostic (with standard and extended EEG/Seizure montages), therapeutic (CPAP and Bi-Level PAP titration), and Multiple Sleep Latency Tests.
