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Enhancing LGBTQ+ Care Provision at LVHN

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Background

- Sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) data is valuable for providers to know about their patients to make their care inclusive, respectful, and comfortable for their patients
- SOGI data is also crucial for providers to have when addressing the health disparities that the LGBTQ+ community faces
 - Sexual orientation = how we describe our emotional or sexual attraction to others
 - Gender identity = an internal understanding of our gender based on what we understand about gender from our culture¹
- The current completion rate of the patient entered questionnaires that collect SOGI data is 51.2%.

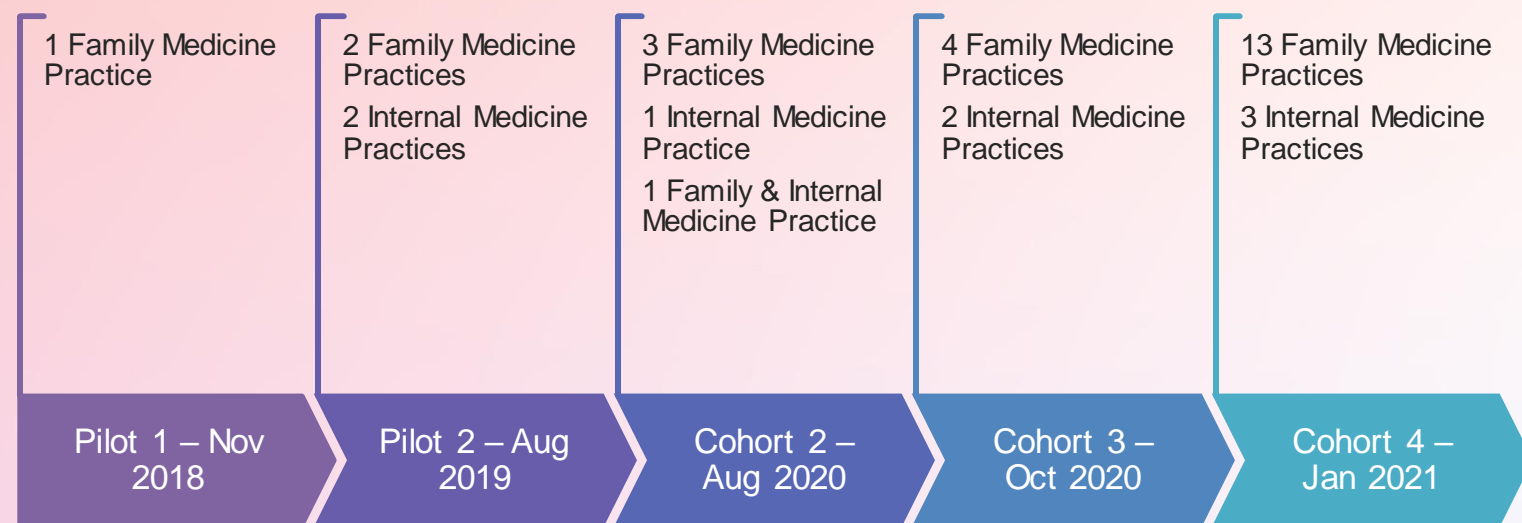
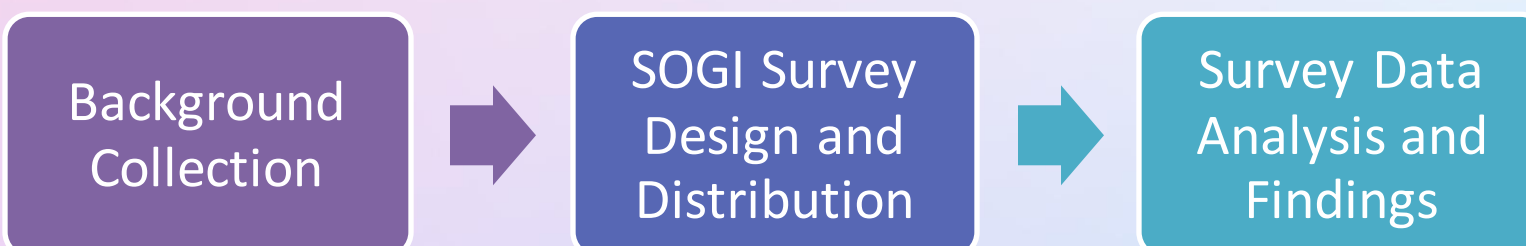


Figure 1. Timeline of when family and internal medicine practices began collection of SOGI data.

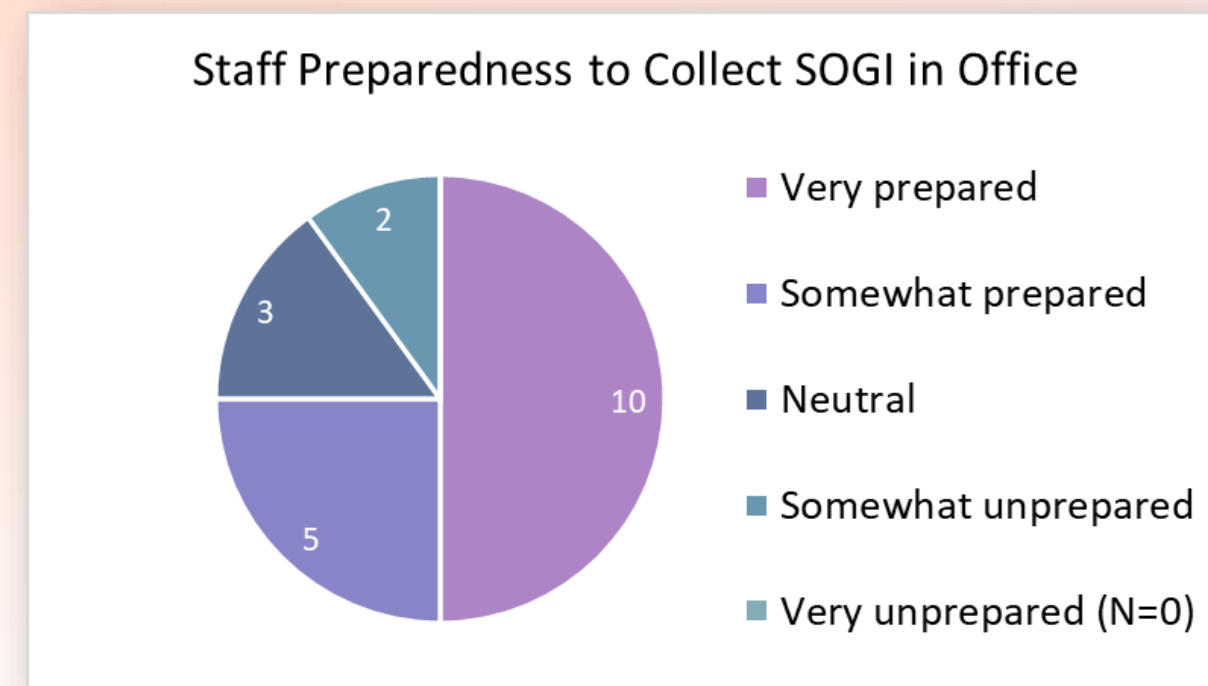


Figure 2. Pie graph of survey responses to the question: how prepared are staff to collect SOGI data in office?

Conclusions

- All practice directors (100% response rate) surveyed were aware of the collection of SOGI data
- Almost 2 in every 3 practice directors received patient feedback on the collection of SOGI data
- Practice directors reported receiving positive and negative feedback on the SOGI data collection process
