Dear Santa,

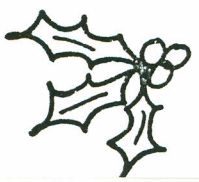
If you come into my house and hear a big yell don't get scared. It will be my dog Blacky. Everybody always steps on him in the dark.
