### LABORATORY LICENSED BY CDC

THE HOSPITAL CENTER has received notice that it is the first and only Hospital Laboratory in the State of Pennsylvania to be licensed by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) in Atlanta to participate in interstate commerce. There are only 3 or 4 commercial laboratories in the State with this licensure, and none in this area.

John J. Shane, M.D., Director of the Clinical Laboratories, stated that with this approval "we can now accept specimens in interstate commerce, but more importantly we can assure our patients and staff physicians that the laboratory service meets the most stringent regulations applicable to laboratory service today."

Congratulations to all of the laboratory personnel involved as the inspection was quite rigorous and this licensure is quite an honor!

## OCCUPATIONAL PRIVILEGE TAX

THE HOSPITAL CENTER is required to withhold occupational privilege tax of \$10.00 from all of its employees and the "big bite" is going to come on payday, March 25.

If any employee has had their  $\underline{1977}$  occupational privilege tax withheld from another employer, has proof of the deduction, and can present this proof at the payroll office before noon on Tuesday, March 22, the tax will not be withheld.

If at the end of 1977, an employee has earned less than \$800, a refund of the occupational privilege tax can be obtained by applying at the Treasurer's Office, Salisbury Township. (The Hospital Center cannot make this refund.)

### ILLNESS OR INJURY WHILE ON THE JOB

EMPLOYEES WHO BECOME ILL OR INJURED while on duty should notify their Supervisor or Department Head and report to Employee Health. Employees should report to the Emergency Room when Employee Health is not open or when an injury is severe and requires immediate treatment.

An incident report  $\underline{\text{must}}$  be completed for every injury occurring while on duty and should be completed within 48 hours of injury. When possible, the incident report should be taken with the employee when going for treatment.

Where a work-related injury or illness has occurred, employees are reminded that the employee must first be seen in Employee Health or the Emergency Room before seeking treatment elsewhere.
