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# Attention Colleagues Who Care for Children: Remember to Renew Your State Clearances

If you're an LVHN colleague who provides care, supervision or guidance to children, or regularly interacts with children, you must renew clearances every five years as mandated by Pennsylvania Act 153. This state law helps ensure that adults who come in contact with children – either paid employees or unpaid volunteers – complete a child abuse and criminal background check.

If it's time to renew your clearances, you will receive an email from Certiphi. Emails from Certiphi are legitimate. Please do not delete them or report them as being a suspicious email.

LVHN contracts Certiphi, a secure third-party vendor, to process our clearances. Read these emails carefully. They contain the information you need to complete these clearances:

- Pennsylvania statewide criminal search (PATCH)
- Child abuse history clearance (CAHC)
- Electronic FBI fingerprint criminal background check

### Outpatient Endoscopy Moves to Hazleton Surgery Center

At LVHN–Hazleton, we continue to strengthen our health care system for the future, and find ways to operate more efficiently and effectively for our community.

With this in mind, LVHN–Hazleton President John Fletcher announced that beginning June 3, 2019, low-risk outpatient endoscopy procedures will be performed at the Hazleton Surgery Center (HSC) located at the Health &



Wellness Center at Hazleton. Inpatient and high-risk endoscopy procedures will continue to be performed at the LVH-Hazleton hospital campus through the operating room.

Moving outpatient endoscopy procedures to the HSC aligns with the goals of the network's Triple Aim of *Better Health, Better Care and Better Cost* by providing better efficiencies and comfort to our patients. The advantages include a more patient-friendly, personalized environment, efficiencies in turn-around times, lower costs to the patient, increased patient privacy, better parking and easy access to the surgery center. Physicians who currently perform outpatient endoscopy procedures at LVH–Hazleton will continue to provide these services at the HSC.

The only change patients will experience is the new location. The process for scheduling an endoscopy continues in the same way through their primary care or specialty care physician.

Hazleton Surgery Center is located at the Health & Wellness Center at Hazleton and was established in 2007 as part of a joint venture with area physicians. Its surgical services consists of four operating rooms and two procedure rooms. State-of the art equipment allows surgeons to perform procedures in the specialty areas of general surgery, gastroenterology, gynecology, ophthalmology, orthopedic, pain management and ear, nose and throat. The facility is accredited by The Joint Commission and certified by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS).
