Preferred EAP: Restoring Personal and Workplace Well-Being Awareness Beyond Mental Health Month

Those of us who work on the frontlines of health care understand how stressful our work can be. We care for people at their most vulnerable time of life and consistently go above and beyond to ensure our patients receive the highest quality health care and a feeling of being cared for. But what about us? How do we care for ourselves when our job is to care for others?

The Advisory Board reported in 2014 that health care workers may be the most stressed employees. According to a CareerBuilder survey of more than 3,200 employees across multiple industries, 69 percent of health care workers report feeling stressed, and another 17 percent report feeling highly stressed.

Fortunately, there is help for all LVHN colleagues.



To expand awareness beyond May's Mental Health Month, LVHN is highlighting the many supportive programs and resources available to LVHN colleagues and their dependents through its employee assistance program. Preferred EAP offers in-person counseling, life coaching and consultation for a wide array of personal and work related concerns, and the services are completely confidential.

"My highly trained and experienced professional staff understands the unique challenges facing those who work in health care," says Carolyn Lamparella, Program Director. "We want to reduce the stigma associated with reaching out for help and provide assistance long before an individual reaches a crisis point."

At Preferred EAP, individuals can seek help for:

Marital, family and work-place relationship conflicts

- Depression and anxiety
- Balancing work and family life
- Stress management
- Life transitions and changes
- Drug- or alcohol-related concerns for self or family
- Anger management
- Grief and loss
- Critical incident stress management
- Accomplishing personal and professional goals

"We're also committed to helping managers and supervisors create a supportive environment for colleagues so they feel comfortable caring for their emotional well-being," Lamparella says. Preferred EAP provides training and consultation to help individuals and teams communicate and problem-solve more effectively. The organization also offers on-site critical incident support for those who experience particularly stressful patient events.

To keep its services accessible for all, Preferred EAP has day and evening appointments, usually within three days, or same-day appointments for urgent matters. The main office is conveniently located in a private location in Allentown, and the organization also works with affiliated providers across the nation for those who reside outside the Greater Lehigh Valley area. "We want to make it as easy as possible for people to take advantage of our services," says Lamparella, "so that getting help doesn't have to be another source of stress."

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
