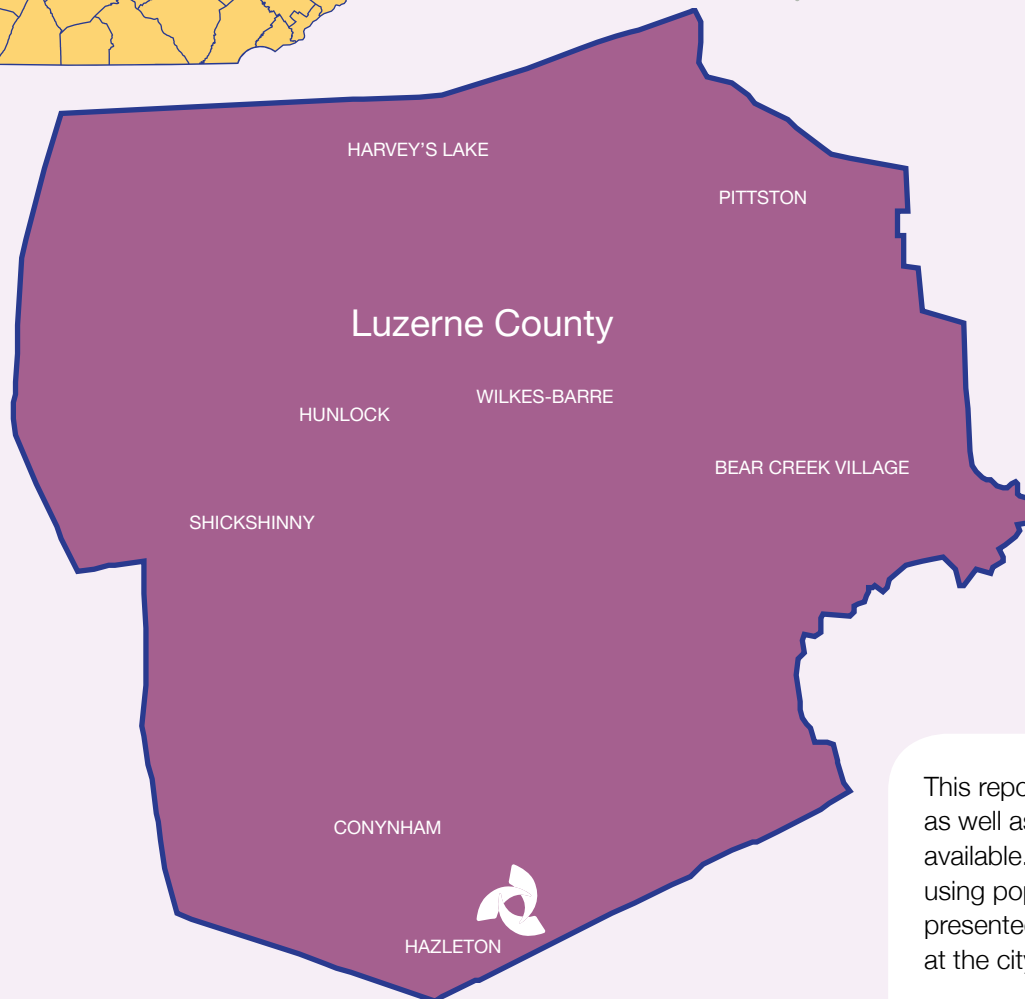

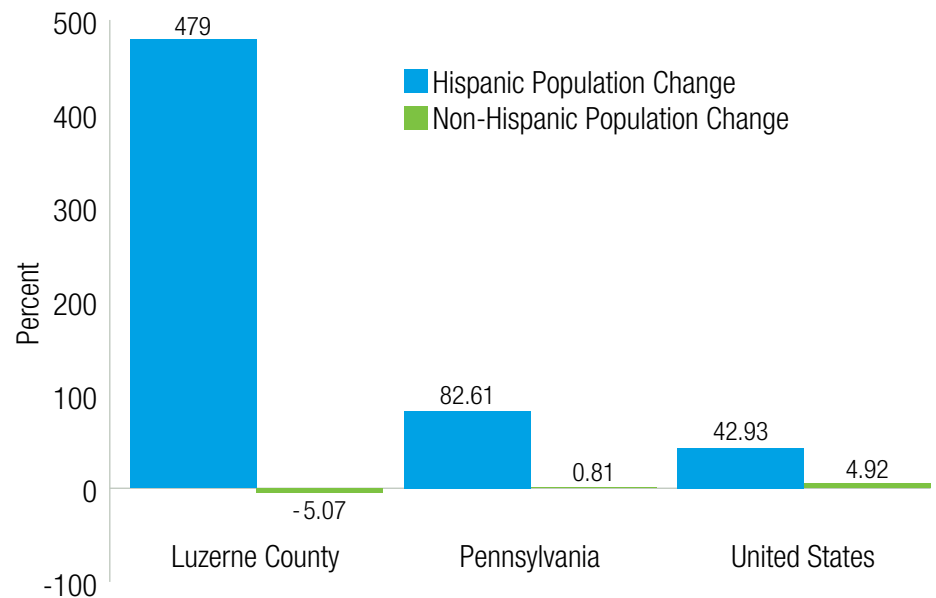

10 percent of the population is Hispanic in Luzerne County. In the city of Hazleton, this percentage increases to 52.5 percent. Furthermore, 17 percent of the population in Hazleton speak a language other than English at home and speak English less than “very well.”



Participants in focus groups and interviews consistently identify significant cultural and language barriers for the growing Hispanic population in Hazleton. Participants state that not all health care facilities have access to interpreter services, which limits the locations non-English speakers can go to access care. In addition, participants call for greater cultural sensitivity among health care staff to create a welcoming and responsive environment for all patients. Participants also state that the Hispanic community tends to be insular, which adds to the cultural divide, and barriers need to be broken down in order to promote unity. Suggestions include utilizing Community Health workers or individuals from within the Hispanic community to begin to bridge the gap in language and cultural barriers.

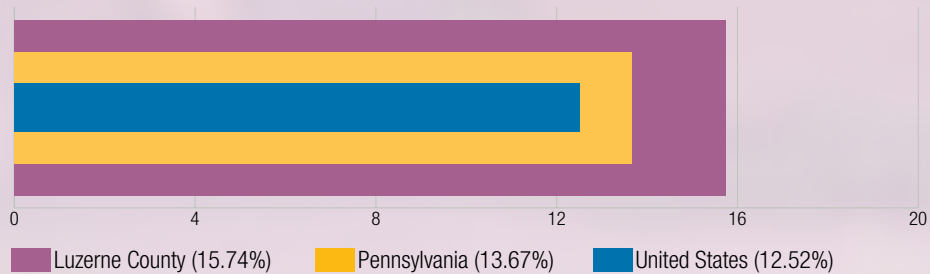

SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC FACTORS

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

Total unemployment in Luzerne County for the current month was 10,150, or 6.4 percent (6.7 percent in Hazleton) of the civilian non-institutionalized population age 16 and older (non-seasonally adjusted). The top five employers in Luzerne County in 2017 were Federal Government, Amazon, PA State Government, Geisinger Wyoming Valley Medical Center and Wilkes-Barre Hospital Company (Department of Labor and Industry, Center for Workforce Information and Analysis).



A lack of job opportunities and job training is noted as a concern in Luzerne County by focus group and interview participants. Participants state that jobs are available; however, unemployment is still a concern because of barriers around language, skills, health and transience. They acknowledge the health implications of being unemployed, such as mental health issues and stress. Unemployment also impacts access to health care because many unemployed community members do not have insurance or money to cover their health care costs. The cyclical nature of being unemployed, which leads to impacts that reinforce staying unemployed, is the theme of the conversations. Participants suggest that LVHN could promote job openings, provide workforce development and recruit in poverty-stricken areas, as well as use medical offices and the hospital as “training grounds” for workforce development.

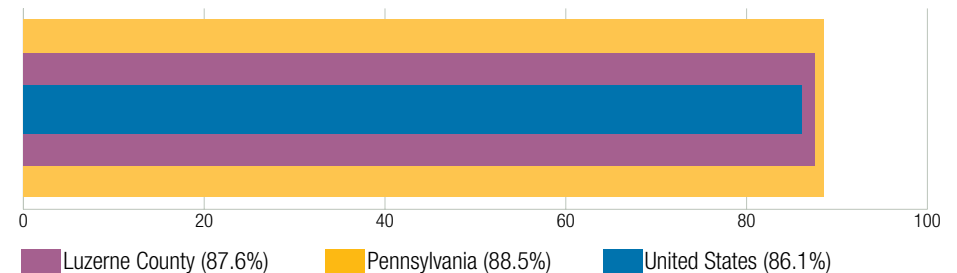

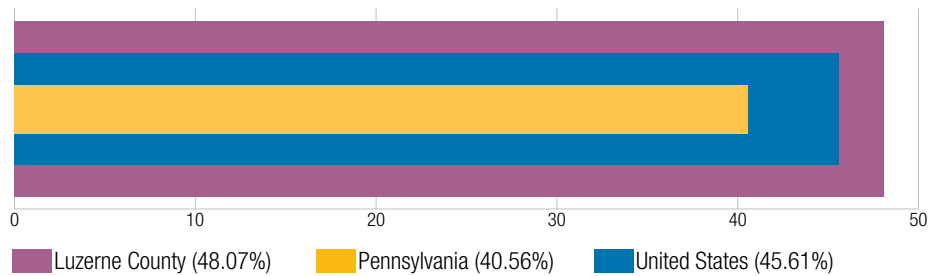

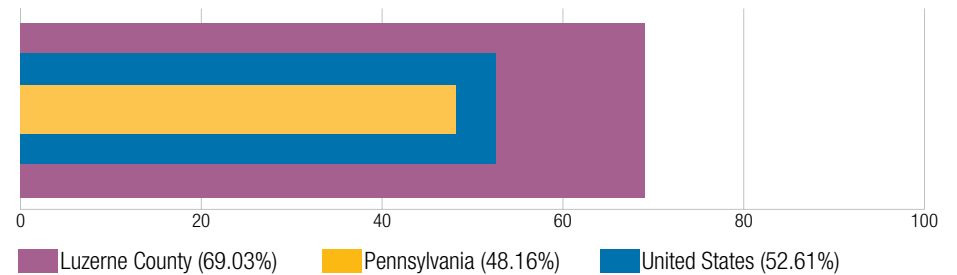

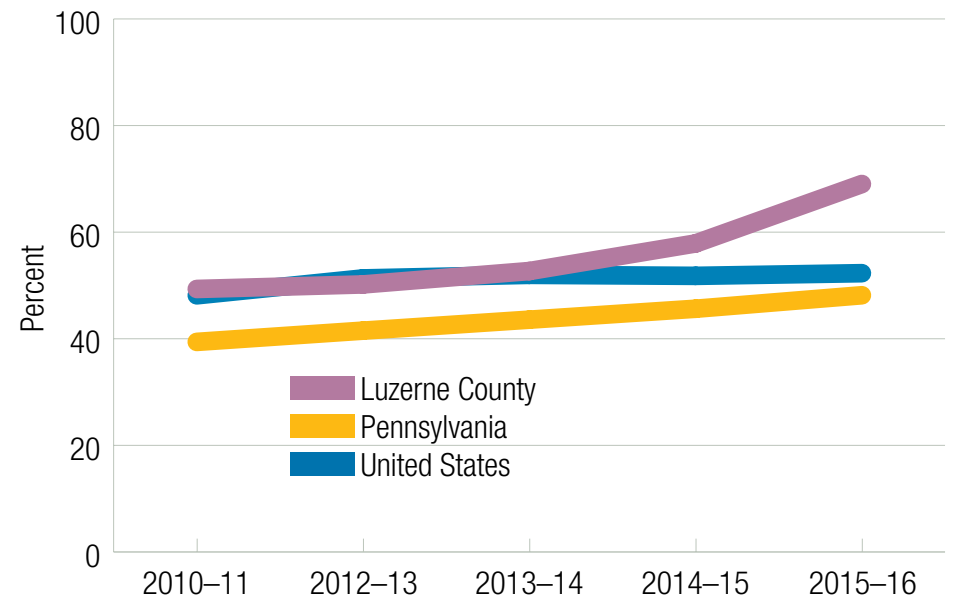

Children Eligible for Free Lunch, by Year

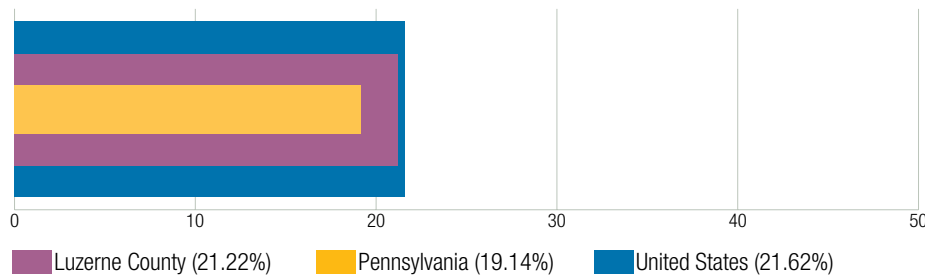

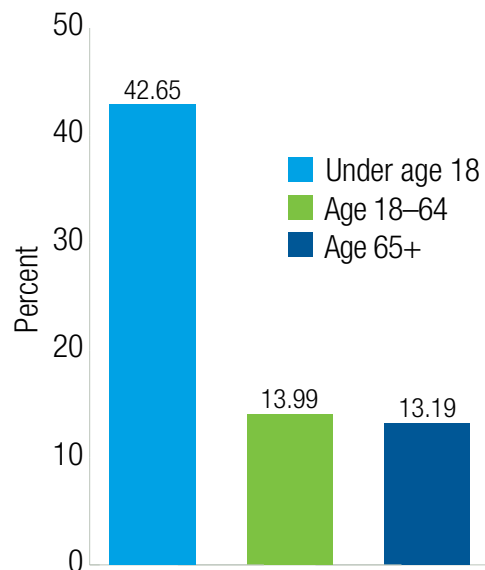

Population Receiving Medicaid by Age Group

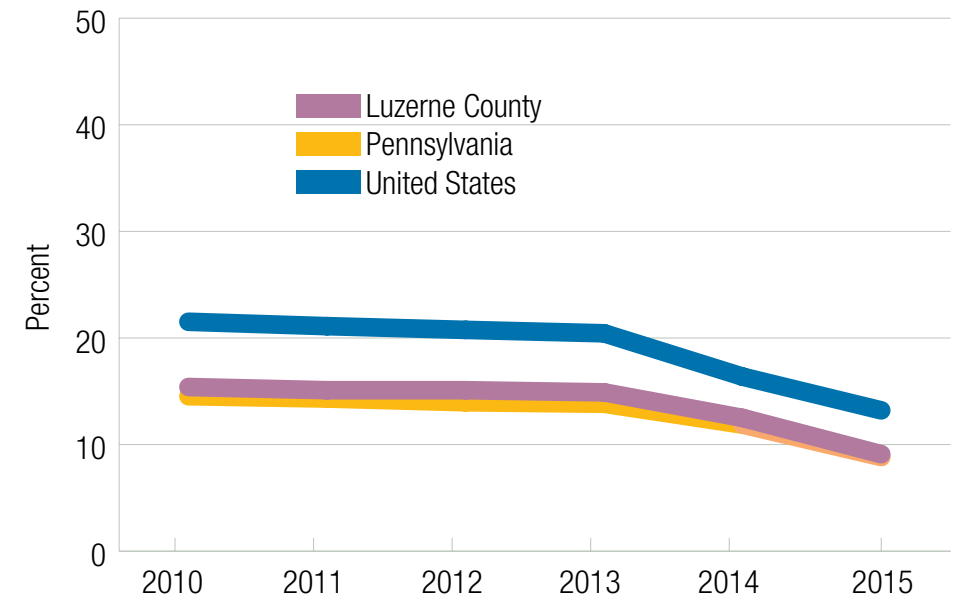

Lack of food access, particularly healthy food access, is a community health issue discussed by focus group and interview participants. There are programs available during the year for children through school, but there is concern about the availability of these programs on weekends and during the summer. The burden of poverty often falls on social service agencies.

FOOD ACCESS

The Food Environment Index ranges from 0 (worst) to 10 (best) and equally weights limited access to healthy foods and food insecurity. There are many facets to a healthy food environment, such as cost, distance and availability of healthy food options. This measure includes access to healthy foods by considering distance an individual lives from a grocery store or supermarket.

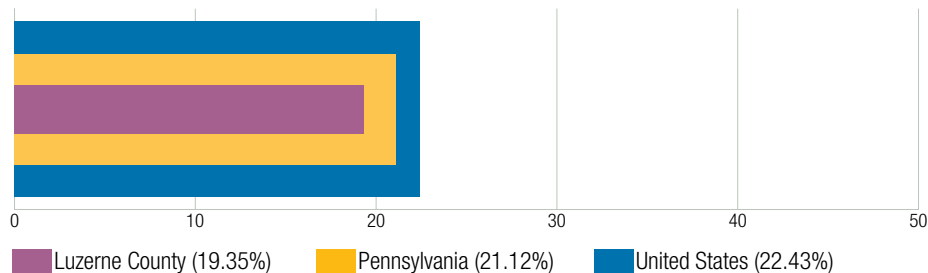

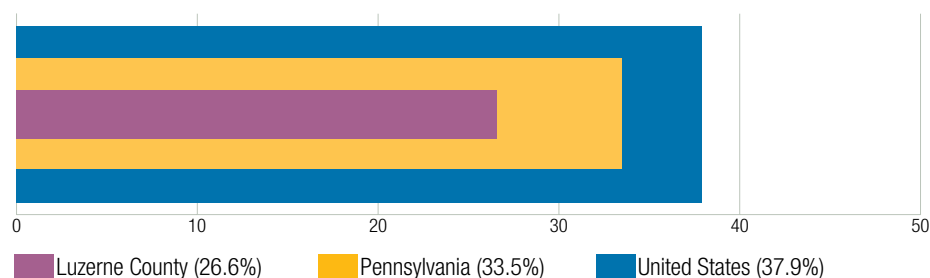

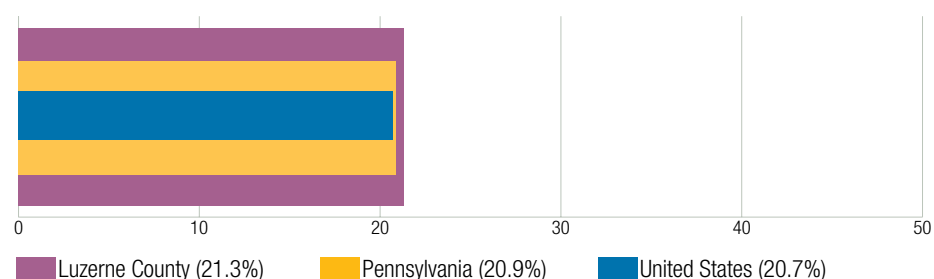

18 percent of the population in Luzerne County receives SNAP benefits and 21 percent lack sufficient social or emotional support.



Community members and stakeholders repeatedly note that health education is needed in schools, such as around oral hygiene, self-care, the impacts of drug use, hygiene and sexual health. Participants suggest having LVHN bring speakers in to discuss important health topics such as chronic disease prevention or management would be helpful.

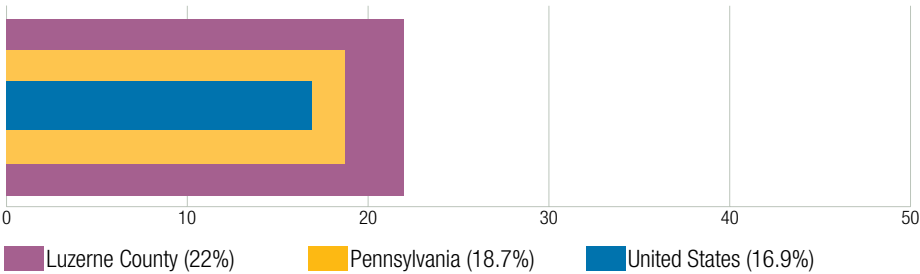

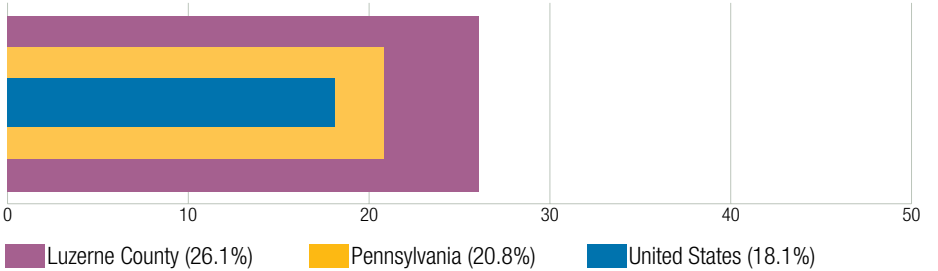

In Luzerne County, there were 1,169 DUI/DWI cases in 2016. This represents a 3.18 percent increase in DUI/DWIs between 2011 and 2016. 22 percent in Luzerne County self-report heavy alcohol consumption.



Drug use is identified as a problem by focus group and interview participants throughout the county, which affects the overall community negatively including around crime and safety issues. Participants highlight that substance use issues also are impacting newborns and young children, including babies who experience failing to thrive, are born underweight, and have developmental delays as a result of mothers using drugs and alcohol. 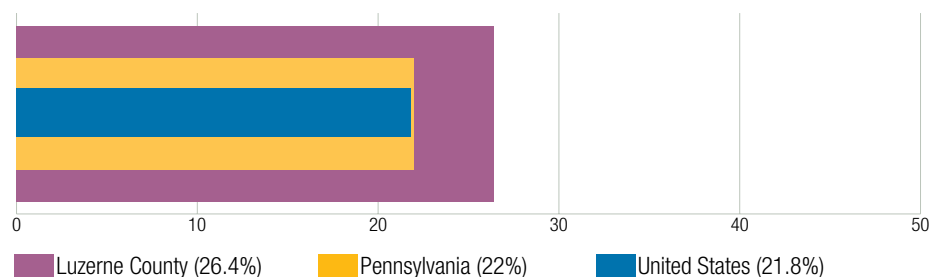

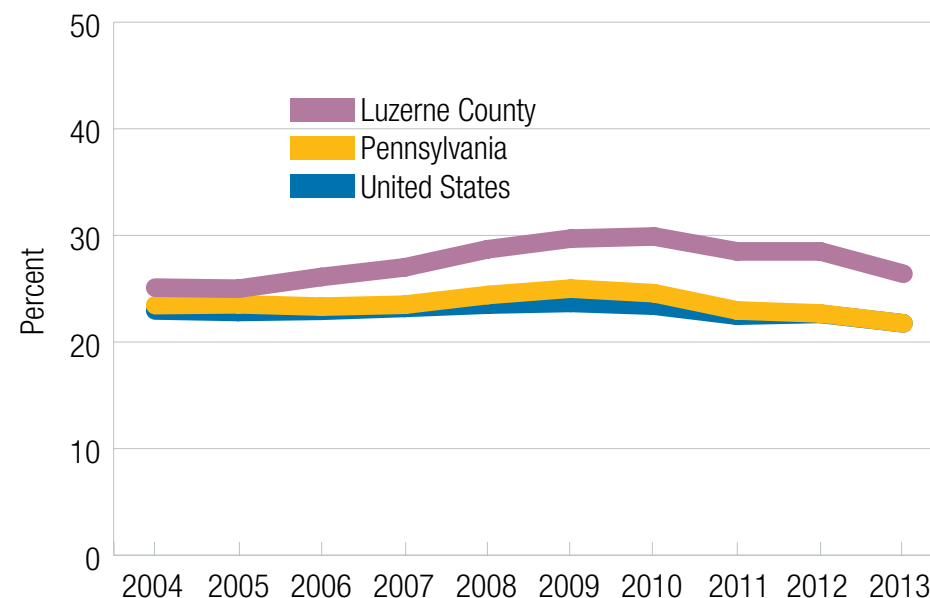

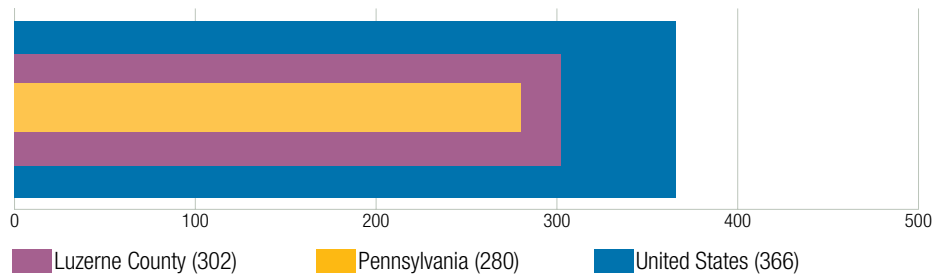

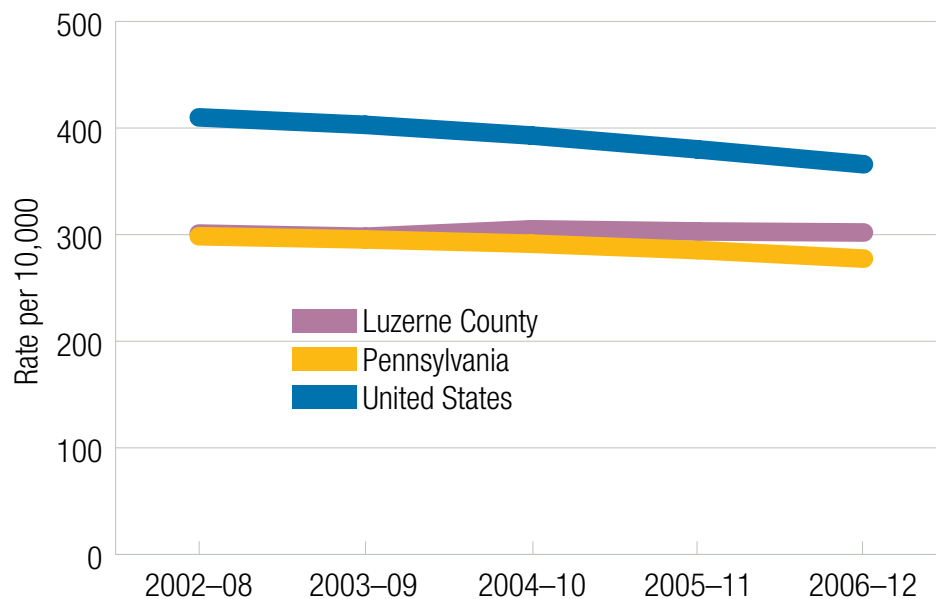

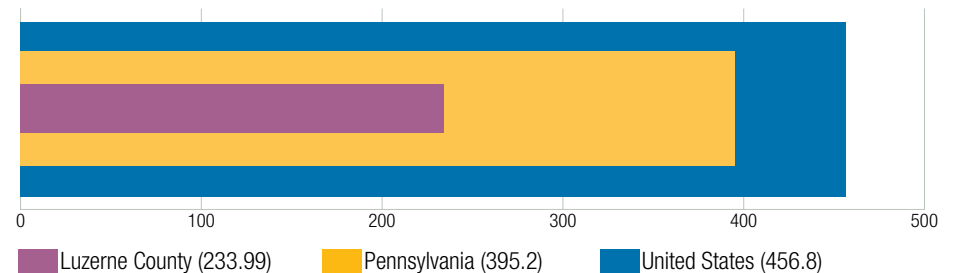

Incidence rate of chlamydia cases per 100,000 population

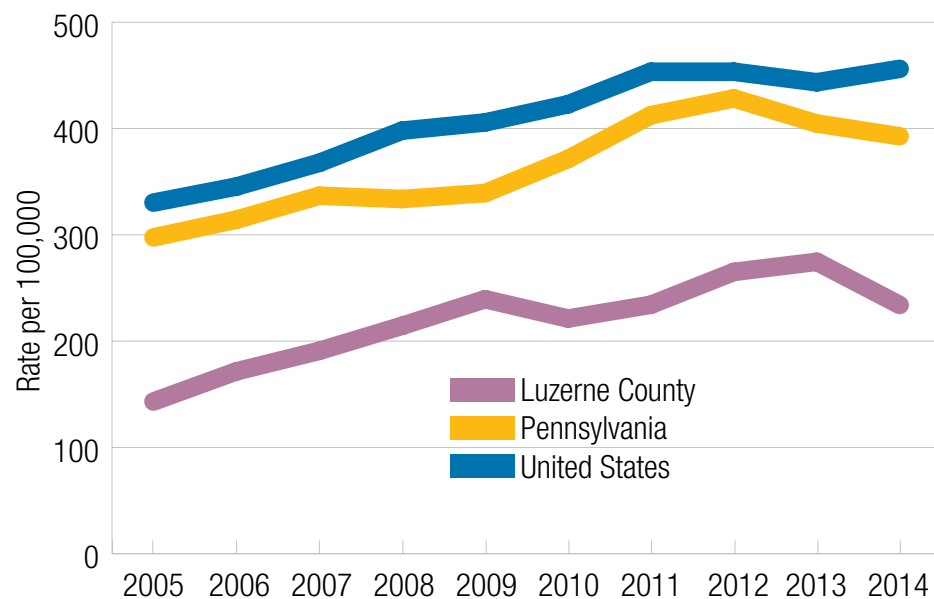

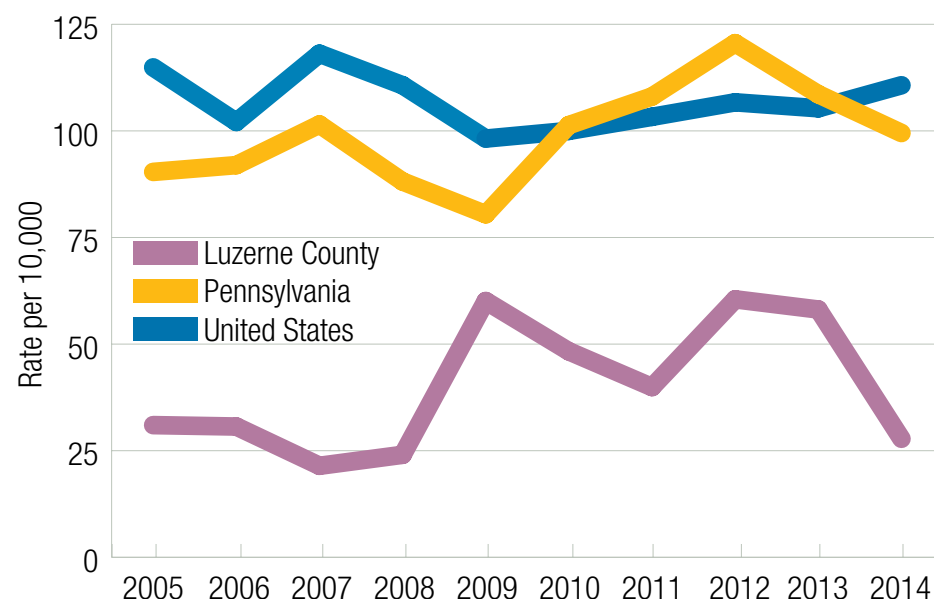

Gonorrhea Incidence Rate (Per 100,000 Population) by Year

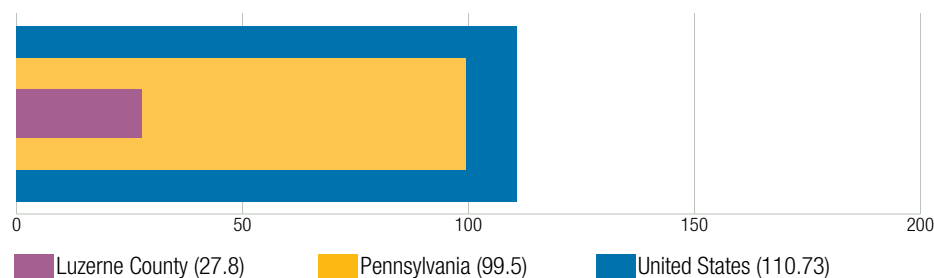

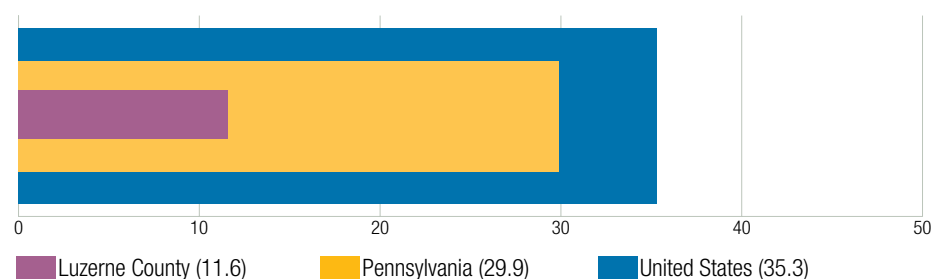

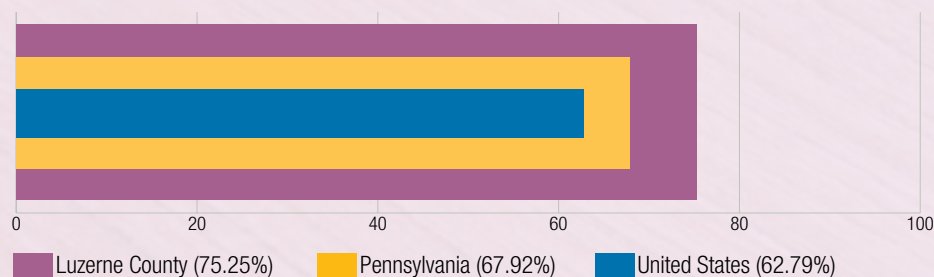

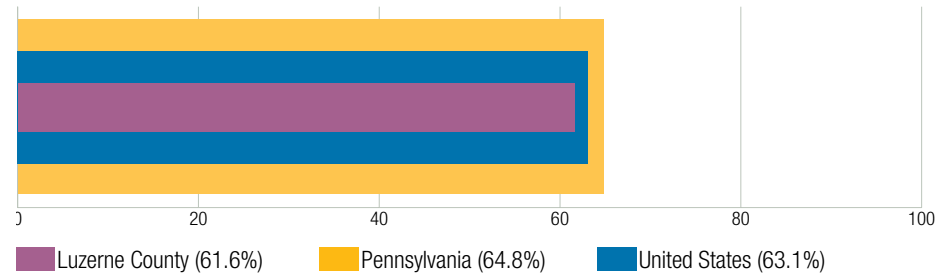

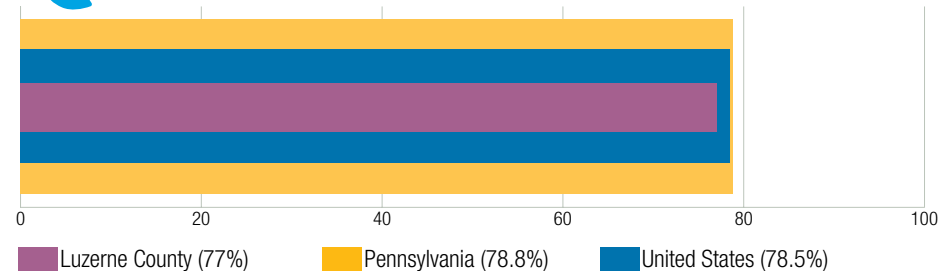

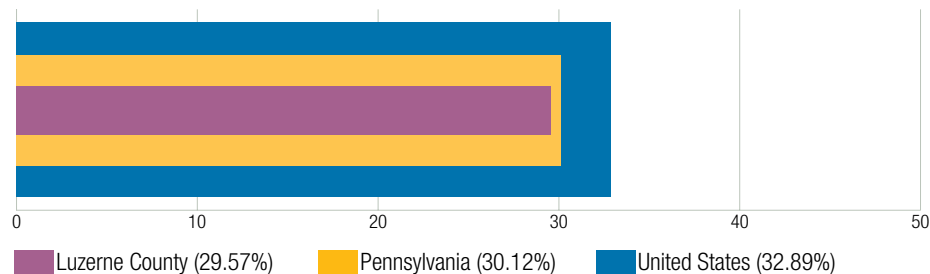

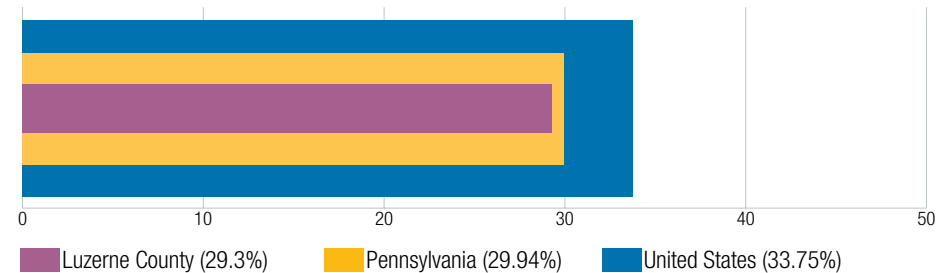

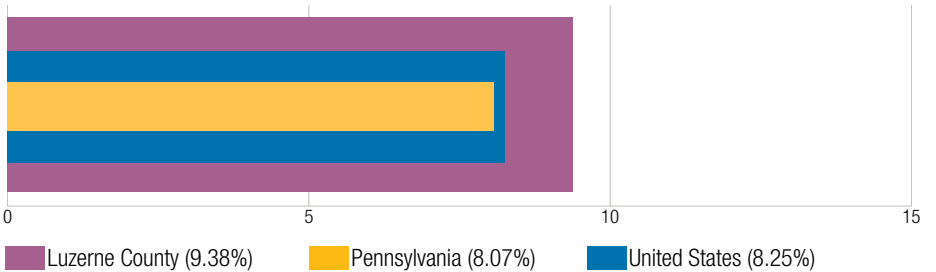

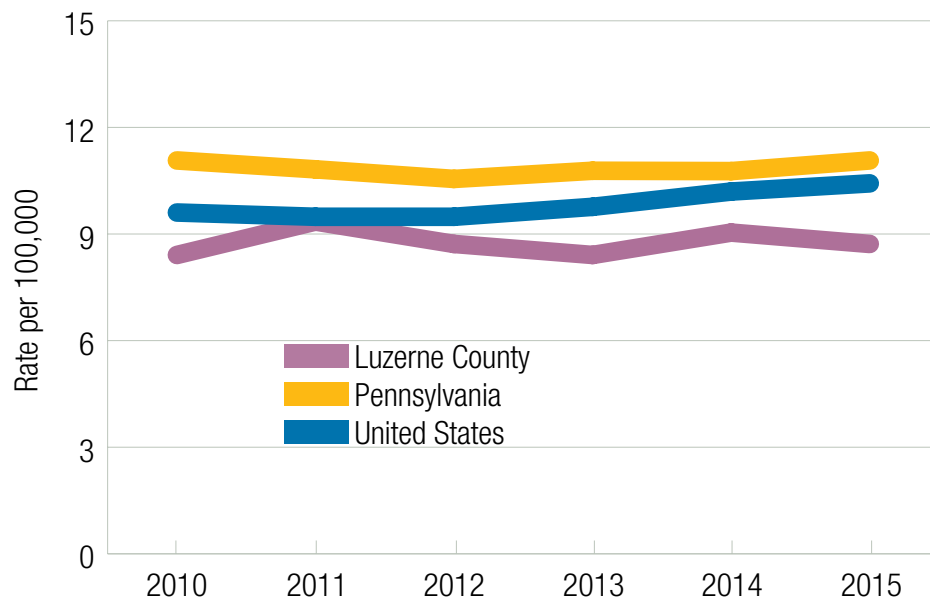

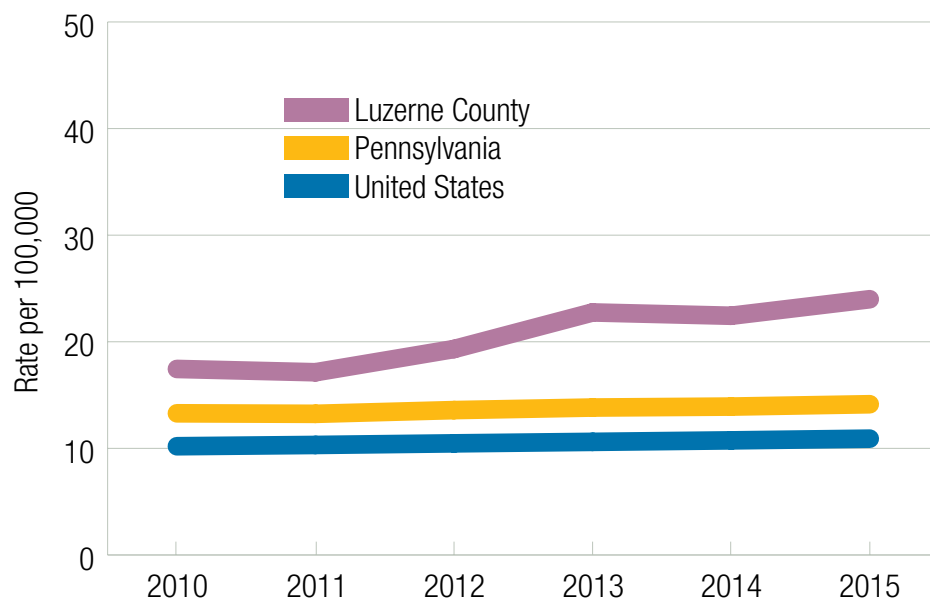

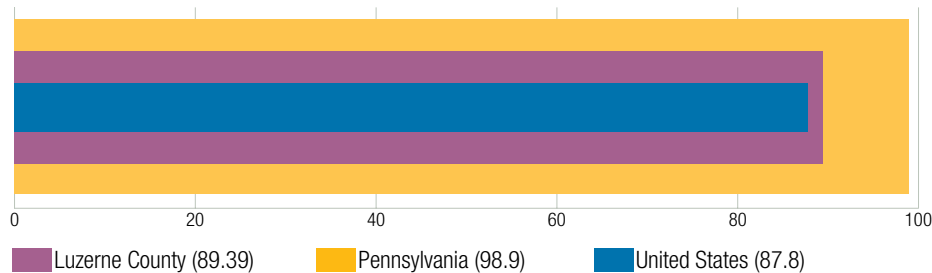

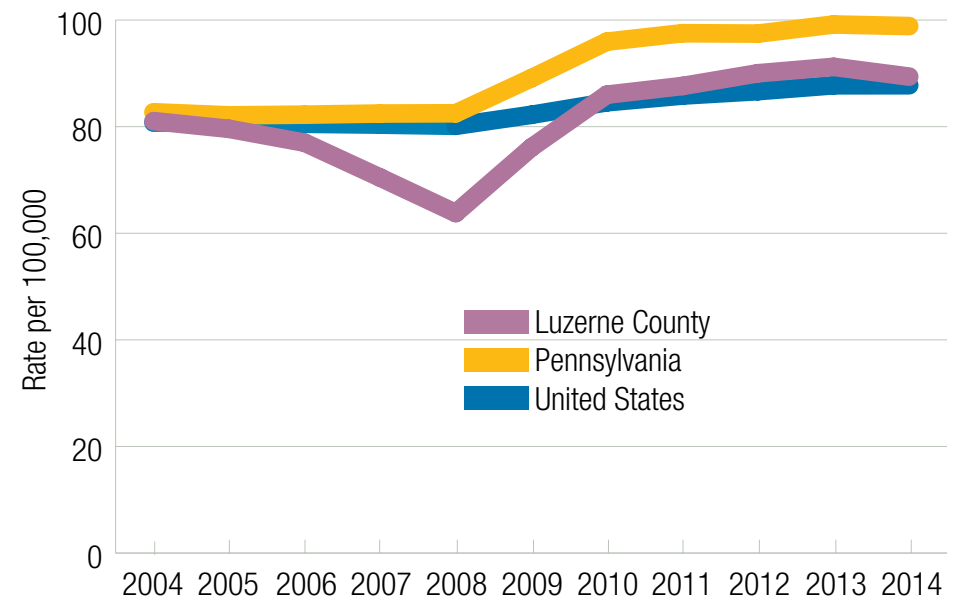

Participants identify that there is more care available locally through LVHN's presence; however, there are still a number of inter-related barriers to care in Hazleton. Participants note a shortage of providers, particularly specialists, which is causing residents to seek care out of the area. They also note that for providers who are present in the community, there is often long wait times to get appointments for primary care, dentists, psychiatry and other providers, which prevents people from getting care in a timely manner and leads to health issues getting worse and becoming emergent. This ultimately leads to individuals utilizing the emergency department for preventive care or minor problems.

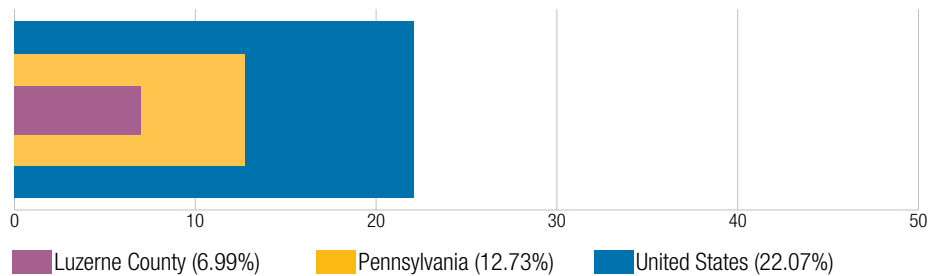
Community members often face transportation barriers to seeking out care. They also experience economic strain regarding health care due to the rising cost of health care, medications, high deductibles and out-of-pocket expenses, which leads to people tending to neglect important care. Further complicating things, health literacy can be an issue, as many community members who do not speak English may not know when to seek care at a doctor's office as opposed to the emergency department.

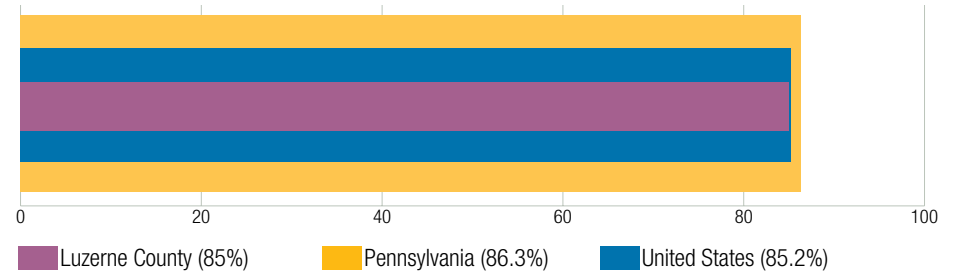

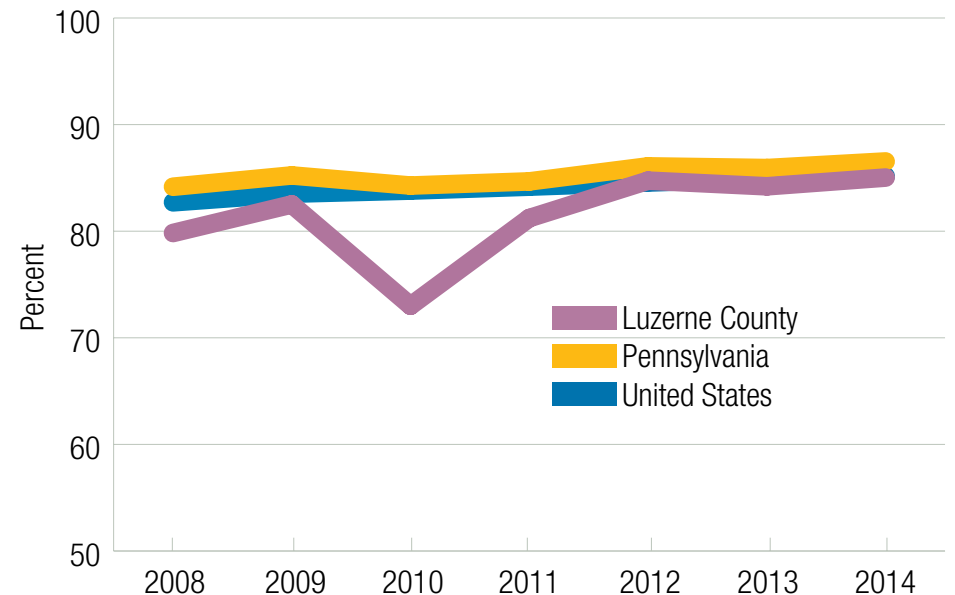

Percent of Medicare Beneficiaries with Diabetes with Annual Hemoglobin A1c Test by Year

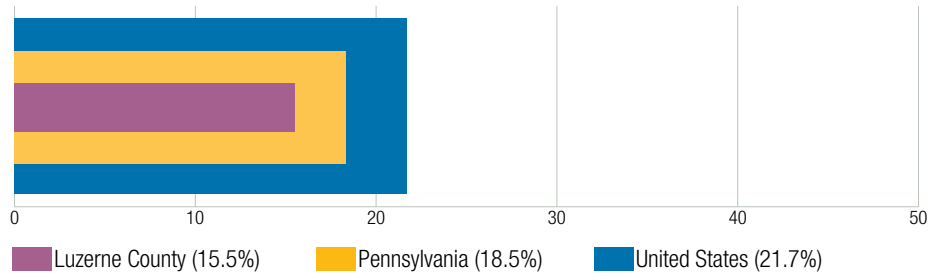

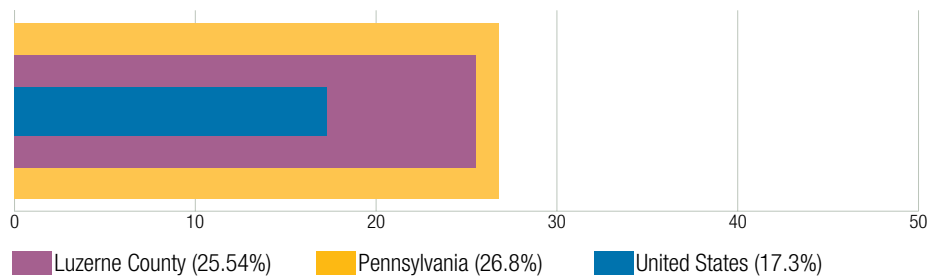

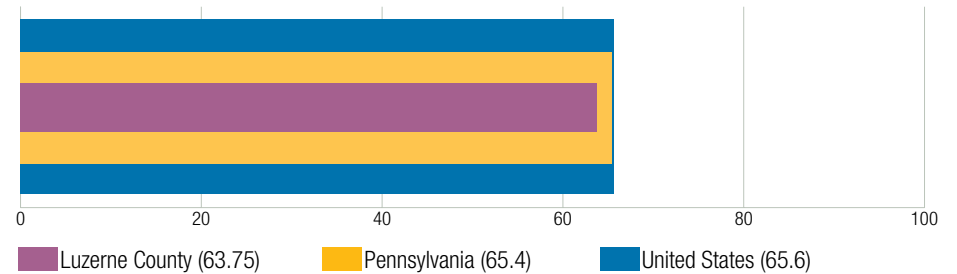

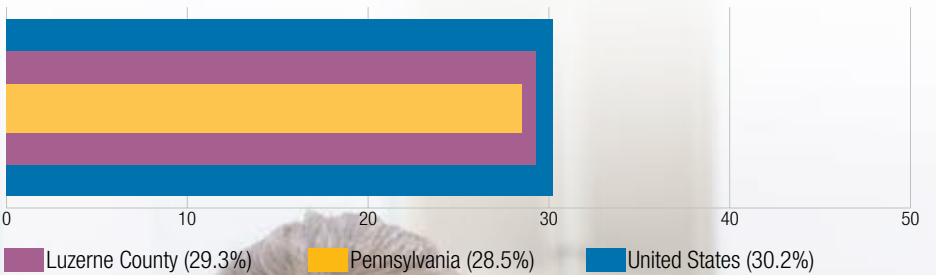

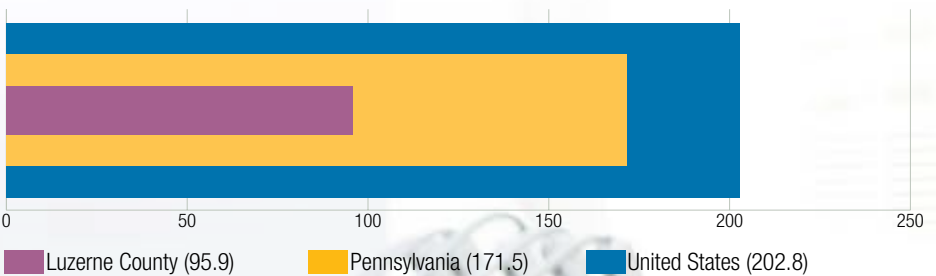

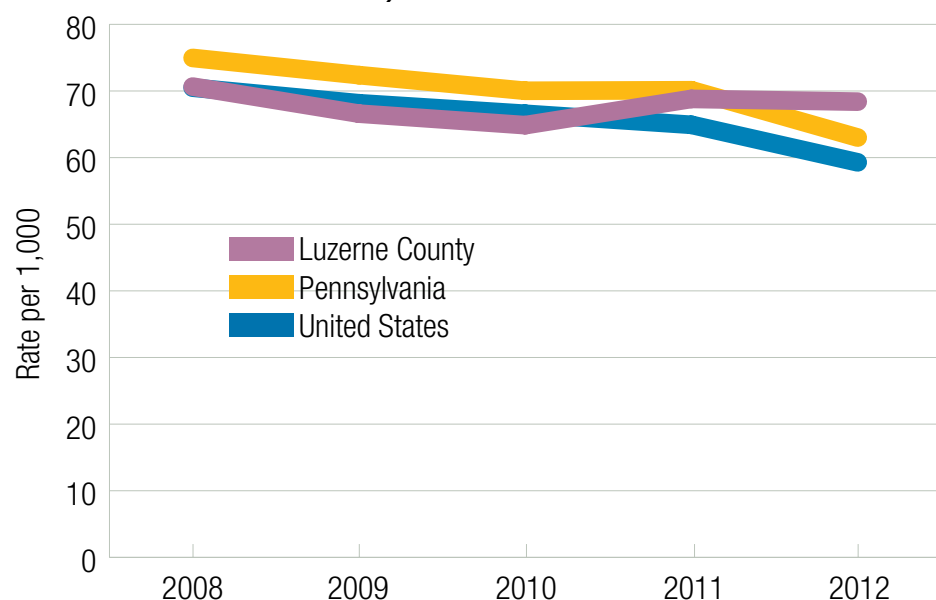

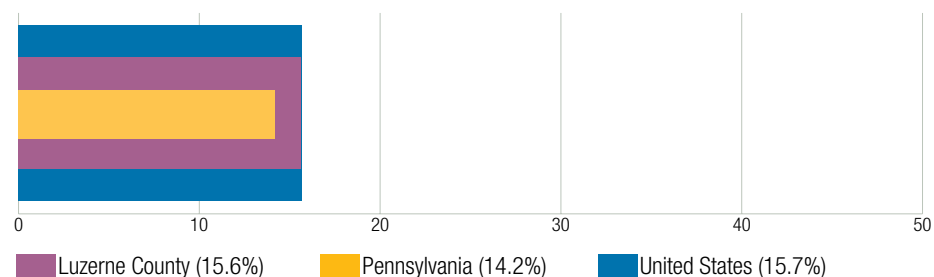

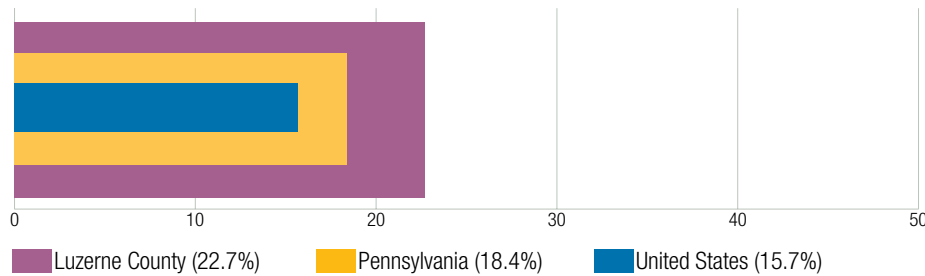

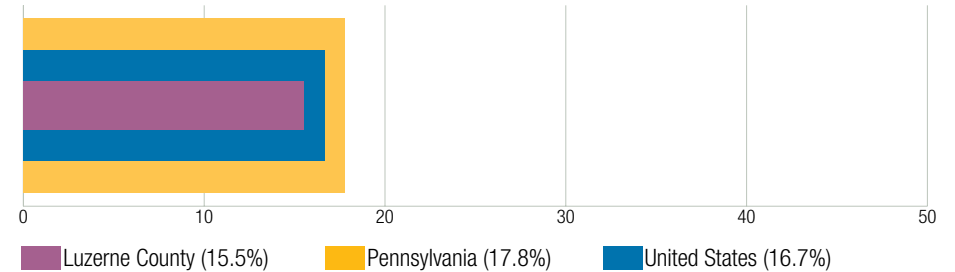

Participants feel that mental health issues cut across all areas of need in the community including the opioid crisis, crime and incarceration. They feel that there are not enough mental health resources in the community, which includes a lack of qualified providers and funding. One participant states, "You can't tell someone in the midst of a mental health issue that they have an appointment next month – t's too late." Some participants also say they would like to see the school system be more attuned to mental health needs of students.

Pennsylvania Youth Survey (PAYS) Data

A total of 2,162 youth from nine middle and high schools in the Hazleton Area School District completed PAYS surveys. Some highlights of the findings from these surveys include:

- Most common early initiation/higher prevalence substance used was alcohol (43.1 percent of students in this district, compared to 43.3 percent at state level). Next most frequent drug used was marijuana, with 13.7 percent indicating lifetime use (compared to 17.7 percent at state level).
- E-cigarette/vaping 30-day use is higher than state averages with over 40 percent of 12th-graders responding positively to use in the last 30 days.
- Most frequent “other” antisocial behavior in Hazleton Area School District was “been suspended from school,” reported by 11.2 percent of students (compared to 7.5 percent at state level).

- 77.5 percent of students in this district reported participating in at least one pro-social activity, compared to 86.5 percent at state level.
- Overall, 24.8 percent of students in this district indicated experiencing bullying in the past 12 months (compared to 28.2 percent of students at state level). Students who indicated experiencing bullying in the past 12 months reported that “some other reason” (40.5 percent of students), “I don’t know why” (37.0 percent of students), and “the way I look [clothing, hairstyle, etc.]” (36.0 percent of students) were the most frequent reasons they were bullied.
- Most common depressed thought was “at times I think I am no good at all,” reported by 37.1 percent of students in this district. 42.2 percent of students reported they felt sad or depressed MOST days in the past 12 months. Overall, 15.0 percent of students had seriously considered attempting suicide, compared to 16.5 percent of students at state level.



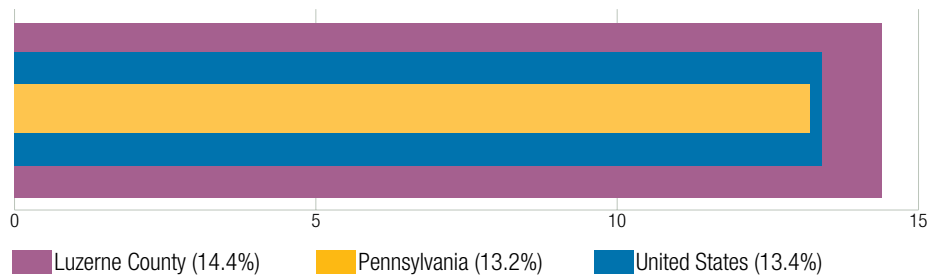

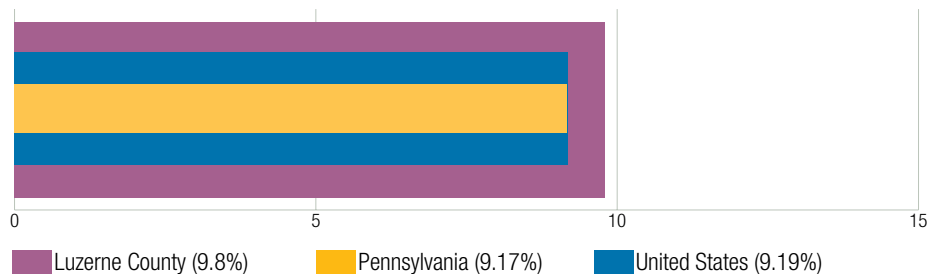

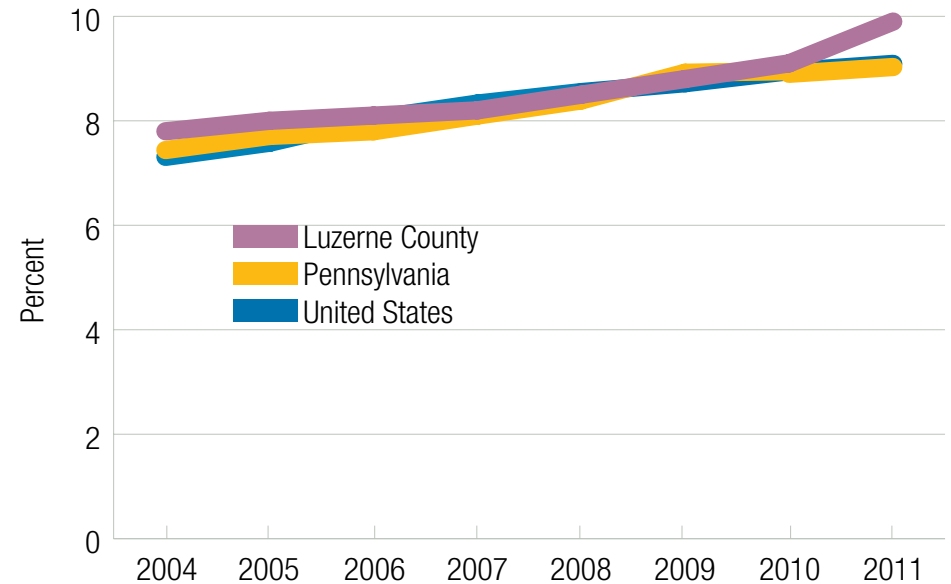

Percent Adults with Diagnosed Diabetes by Year

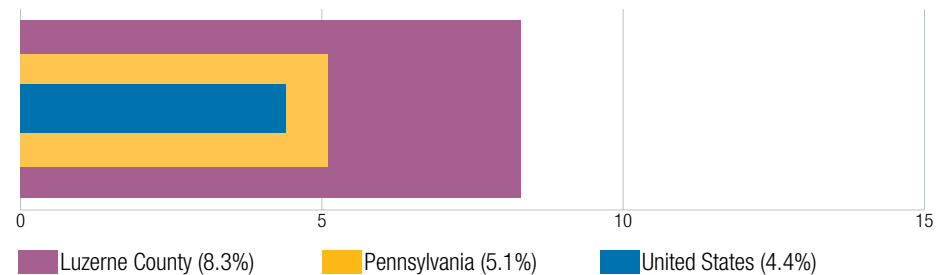

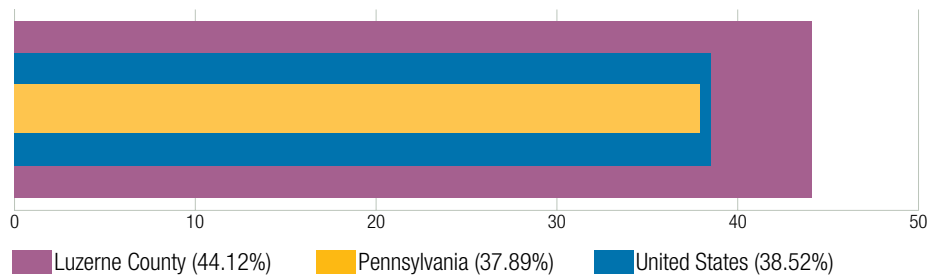

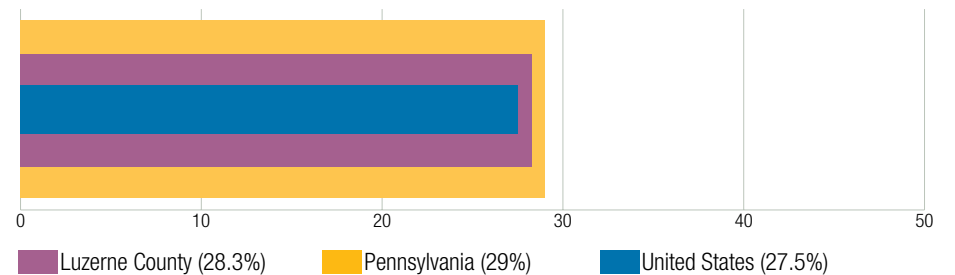

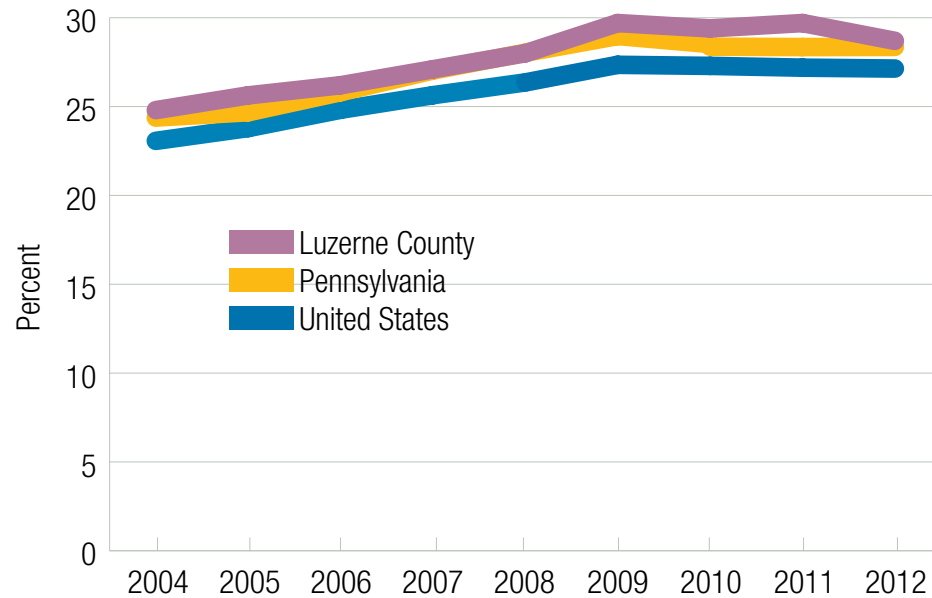

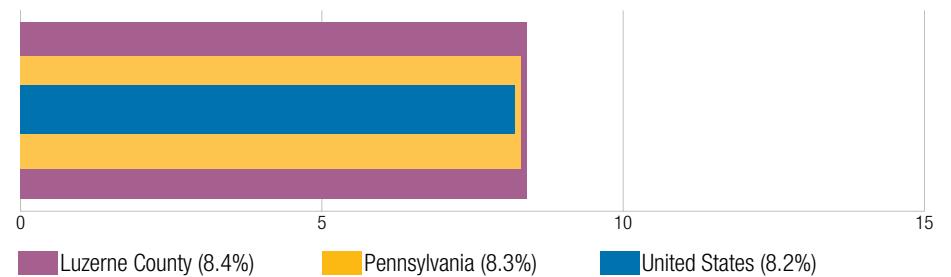

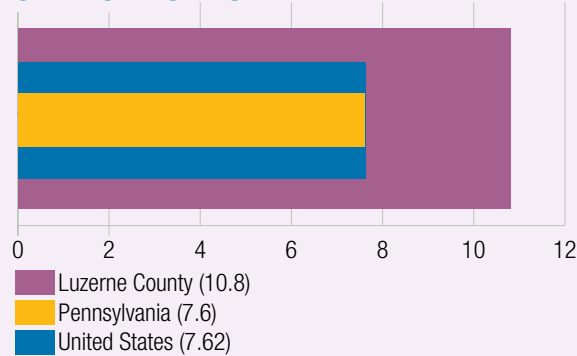

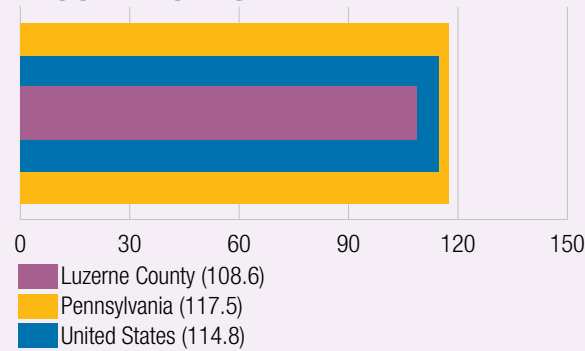


ANNUAL CANCER INCIDENCE (RATE PER 100,000 POPULATION)

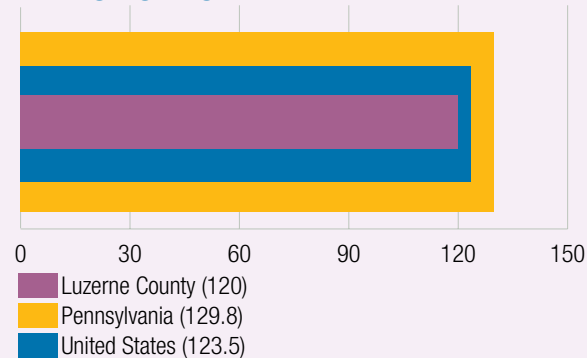

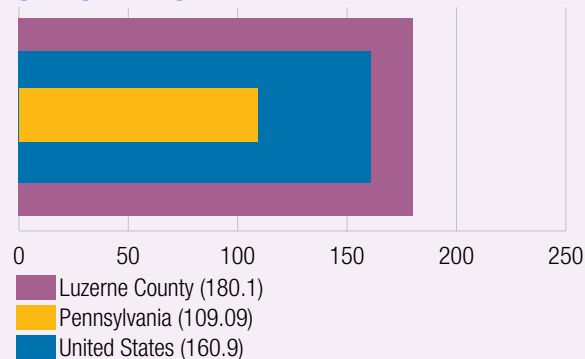
Participants in focus group and interviews identify a concern with the higher-than-average cancer incidence rate in Luzerne County and express a need for cancer prevention services as well as more cancer care. Participants highlight environmental factors such as working with carcinogenic chemicals, illegal dumping, radon and environmental damage from the region's coal-mining industry as potential causes of the increased incidence; health behaviors, such as smoking, contribute as well.

LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH AGE-ADJUSTED DEATH RATE (PER 100,000 POPULATION)

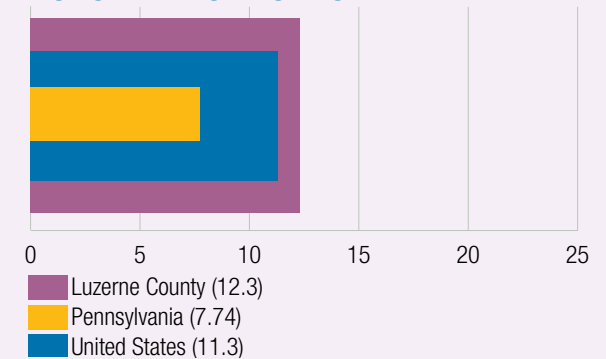

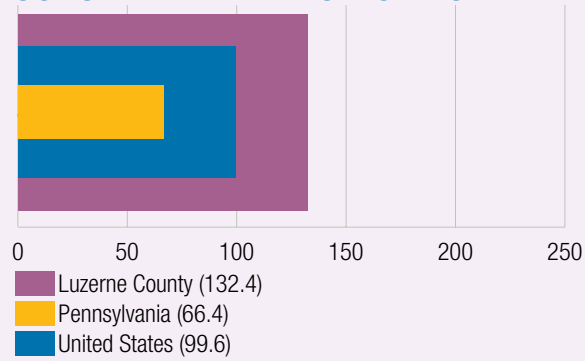

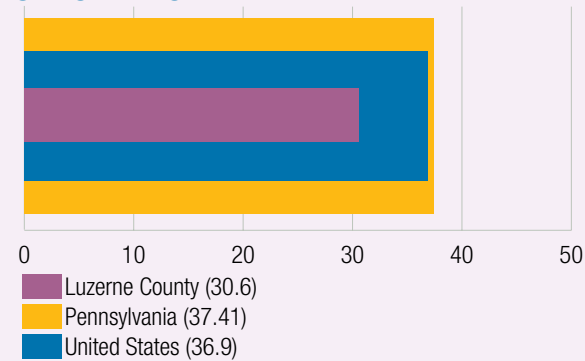

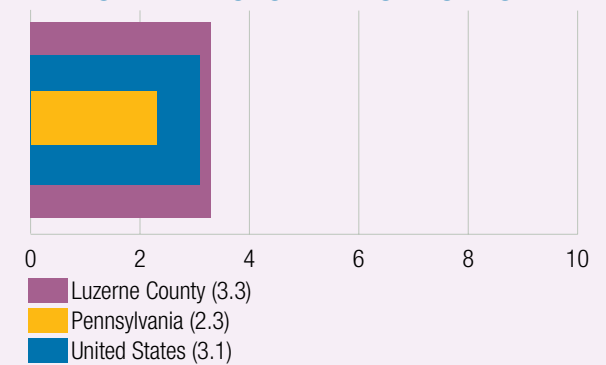

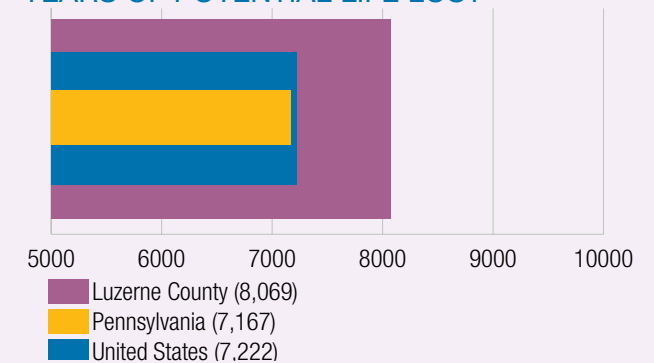

SUMMARY OF DATA

- A total of 29,474 people live in Hazleton and a total of 318,917 live in Luzerne County.
- Almost 19 percent of the population in Luzerne County is age 65 or older; 20 percent of the population age is 17 or younger.
- The median family income in Luzerne County is \$61,155; 65.3 percent of the population in the county is white.
- 10 percent of the population is Hispanic in Luzerne County. In the city of Hazleton, this percentage increases to 52.5 percent. Furthermore, 17 percent of the population in Hazleton speak a language other than English at home and speak English less than “very well.”
- In Hazleton, 25 percent of the population does not have a high school diploma and 12 percent has a bachelor’s degree or higher. 52 percent of fourth graders in Hazleton have “not proficient” or worse reading skills.
- 52.3 percent of individuals in Hazleton are living in poverty and 100 percent of children are eligible for free/reduced price lunch.
- 36.2 percent of the insured population in the city of Hazleton receive Medicaid. 21 percent of the larger county who receive Medicaid are uninsured.
- 18 percent of the population in Luzerne County receives SNAP benefits and 21 percent lack sufficient social or emotional support.
- In Luzerne County, there were 1,169 DUI/DWI cases in 2016. This represents a 3.18 percent increase in DUI/DWIs between 2011 and 2016. 22 percent in Luzerne County self-report heavy alcohol consumption.
- 26.4 percent of individuals in Luzerne County report no leisure time for physical activity.
- In Luzerne County, for every 10,000 adolescents in the community about 302 have had a baby. In the Hispanic population in Luzerne County, the rate increases to 710 adolescents giving birth for every 10,000 who identify as Hispanic.
- 36.6 percent of households in Hazleton spend 30 percent or more of household income on housing. 38 percent of housing units in Hazleton have at least one substandard condition.
- 7 percent of adults in Luzerne County lack a consistent primary care provider.
- 25.5 percent of pregnant women in Luzerne County receive late or no prenatal care.
- 29 percent of adults have not visited the dentist in the last year.
- 16 percent in Luzerne County report poor or fair health. Community members report an average of 4 poor physical days last month.
- 22 percent of adults in Luzerne County report poor dental health. Individuals also report an average of 4.2 poor mental health days per month.

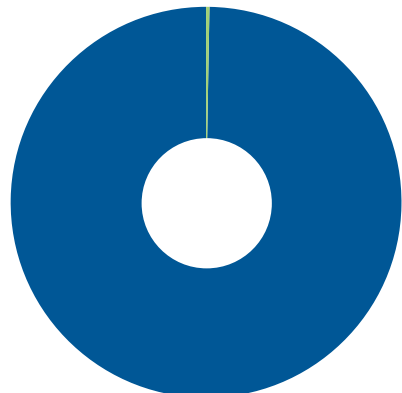

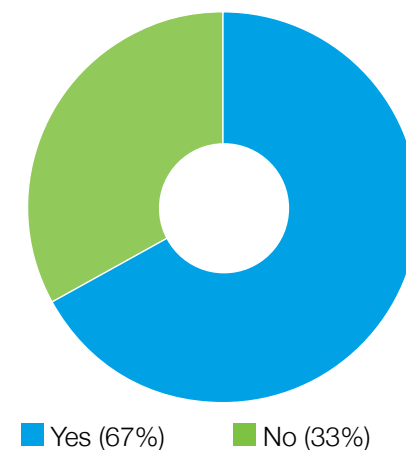


- Among respondents, 8.6% (N = 20) have had someone talk to them about genetic counseling.
- 30.4% (N = 70) have had a family member receive hospice care for cancer.
- 13% (N = 30) had a family member receive palliative care.
- 49.5% (N = 114) said they would consider participating in a clinical trial.
- 94.6% (N = 127) of women over the age of 40 reported ever having a mammogram done.
- Among male respondents (N = 80) 23.8% always practice testicular self-exams, 42.5% practice sometimes, and 32.5% never practice self-exams.
- Respondents reported having been screened for some type of cancer, including skin (28%), cervical (30.7%), prostate (18.2%), oral (13.3%) and lung (10.2%).
- The most common reason respondents did not get a screening was they did not know they needed a screening (N = 40). Other reasons included not having a provider, lack of transportation, fear of possible results and lack of access to a screening.

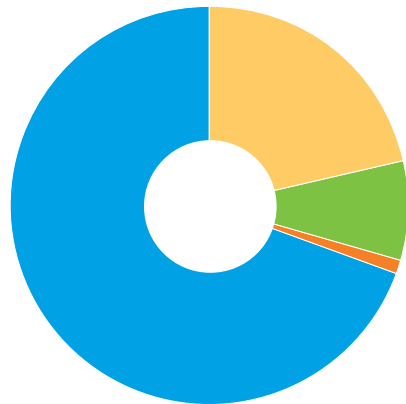

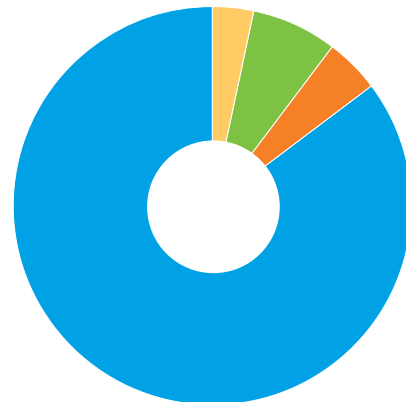

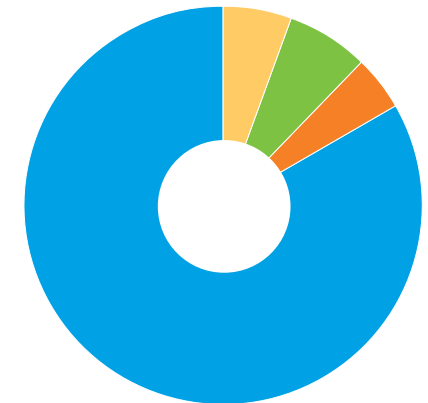

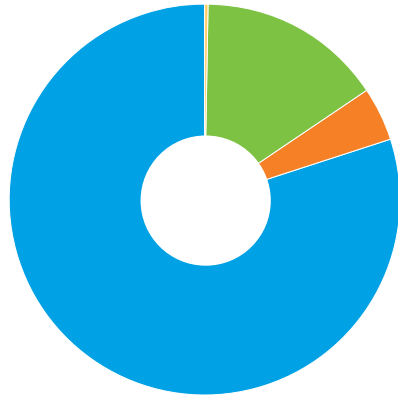

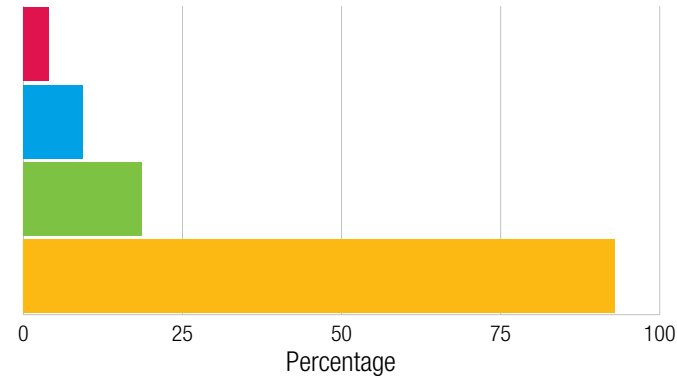
- 74.6% of respondents (N = 170) had not been immunized against HPV. 14.5% (N = 33) were unsure. 5.7% (N = 13) received the immunization.
- 35.1% (N = 80) were immunized against hepatitis B, while 44.3% (N = 101) were not. 18.9% (N = 43) did not know whether they received it.
- Of respondents with children age 11-26 (N = 66) 48% said their children were not immunized against HPV. 44% said their children were immunized. 7.5% said they were unsure.
- 71% of respondents (N = 149) rely on their medical providers for obtaining medical information. 46.7% (N = 98) rely on the internet, 42.4% (N = 89) rely on family and friends, and 22.9% (N = 48) rely on TV for their information.

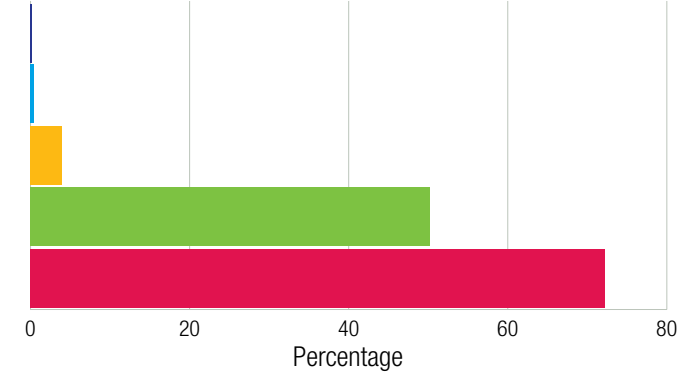

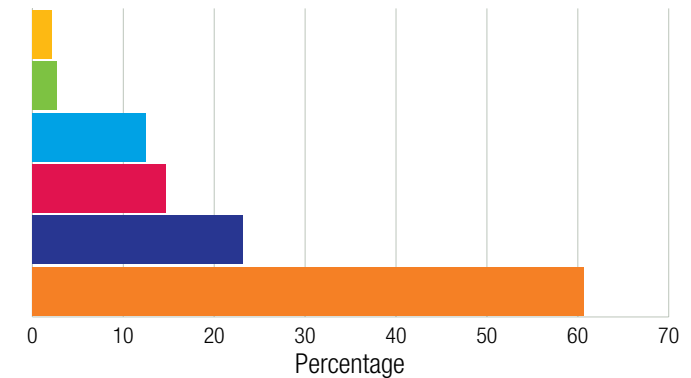

- When asked, "Have you ever chosen NOT to fill a prescription because the medication was too expensive?" 21.8% (N = 50) said yes, but not often. 7.9% (N = 18) said yes, often.
- 51.7% of respondents (N = 119) said that they would be interested in using complementary, integrative, alternative medicine offered by LVHN.
- 27% of those surveyed (N = 62) use complementary, alternative, or integrative services or products.
- Of those, 38% (N = 21) said those services were recommended by their doctor.
- The top five utilized services were chiropractic (74.1%), massage (44.8%), relaxation techniques (34.5%), aromatherapy (29.3%) and herbs (27.6%).
