NEUROLOGY COURSE PRESENTED

Lawrence Levitt, M.D., Chief of the Division of Neurology, recently taught a post-graduate intensive clinical neurology course at the Americana in New York. The course, designed for internists, general practitioners, family physicians, and psychiatrists, and based on the book, Neurology for the House Officer, coauthored by Dr. Levitt and Dr. Howard Weiner, presented a problem oriented approach to common neurologic problems.

One hundred sixteen physicians from all over the country attended the 3-day course, including Drs. Don and Debbie Pepper, Dr. Sam Bub, Dr. William Dewar, and Dr. John Benner from the Hospital Center.

Dr. Levitt's book has recently been published in Japanese and is scheduled for publication in two other languages.

MICROBIOLOGIST TO PRESENT PAPER

John Salventi, Ph.D., Microbiologist, will present a paper entitled "Effect of Blood Dilution on the Recovery of Organisms from Blood Cultures in Medium Containing SPS" at the American Society for

Microbiology National Convention in Las Vegas, Nevada, May 14-19, 1978.

Dr. Salventi's paper is a study comparing recovery rates of bacteria from blood at various dilutions in an attempt to increase the efficiency of detection. The blood was taken from patients suspected of having bacteria in their blood streams.

initial evaluation by consultant to determine exercise prescription, scheduled exercise classes (1 hour) including ballet (Tuesday) and yoga (Wednesday), sauna, sunroom, whirlpool, dietary bar, large lounge, instructor always available, and locker room.

CHILD ABUSE WORKSHOP

The abused child will be the topic of an all day workshop on Tuesday, April 18, at Cedar Crest College, Alumni Hall. Sponsored by the Community Health Education Committee of LVAHEC, the workshop is

aimed at all people interested in child care: physicians, nurses, social workers, attorneys, teachers, etc.

The workshop objectives include determination of child abuse or neglect, responsibility of the individual in treatment and reporting of child abuse or neglect, identification of responsibility of the participant's profession in dealing with abusive families, and utilization of local resources that serve the abused child and family.
