NURSES' SCHOOL TO BE DEDICATED TODAY

Former President Taft to Deliver Principal Address.

Allentown will be honored to-day with the presence of former President W. H. Taft, who will be here to take part in the dedication of the new nurses' college at the Allentown Hospital and to attend the annual banquet of Jordan Lodge of Masons this evening in Mealey's Auditorium. The dedication will take place at 2 p. m. and it will be a great occasion. Many distinguished men will attend and take part in the ceremony.

A number of citizens went to Philadelphia last evening to greet the visitors and to escort them to this city. They will take breakfast at the Union League and will leave Philadelphia for Allentown by Liberty Bell trolley at 11 a. m.

The sisters of the late Judge Harvey, the donor of the college, will be here and will be the guests of Mayor-elect A. L. Reichenbach, as will also be George T. Brewster, of Tottenville, S. I., the maker of the bronze bust of Mr. Harvey, which is in the memorial reception hall at the college. Mrs. Brewster will accompany her husband.
