WLVT HONORED FOR OPEN HEART SPECIAL

WLVT-TV, Channel 39, recently won a gold "Hugo" at the 15th Annual Chicago Film Festival for the documentary "Open Heart Surgery - The Coronary Artery Bypass."

The special, broadcast in April on the successful "On Call: A Valley Health Series" program on Channel 39, was produced in cooperation with WLVT by the Hospital Center's Television Department.

David Ogden Stiers, of the CBS hit series M*A*S*H, narrated the program, which featured videotaped surgical sequences from the Hospital Center's open heart operating room.

The "Hugo" award is the highest honor in the educational category for local television production worldwide.

Richard G. Cipoletti, Assistant Administrator for Human Resources and executive in Charge of TV Production, considers the open heart special "our best effort to date with the "On Call" series. With this award, we've been reassured that we are capable of achieving a high level of excellence and quality in every show we produce."

Funding for the special was provided by the Dorothy Rider Pool Health Care Trust and Air Products and Chemicals, Inc. William P. Ferretti, Pool Trust Executive Director, believes that the joint effort of A&SHHC and WLVT-TV play a major role in the success of both the series and the open heart special.

Cipoletti and Ferretti agree that the award emphasizes A&SHHC's commitment to community health education.

"Television has been proved a highly educational medium. It's working for "On Call." I think the National recognition that comes with the award is well deserved, Ferretti states.

According to producer Paul Dowling, it was believed that at the time of taping, the open heart special had the most extensive coverage of an actual operation ever shown on television.

WLVT-TV plans to rebroadcast "Open Heart Surgery - The Coronary Artery Bypass" at 7:30 P.M., on Monday, January 21, and at 2:30 P.M., Saturday, January 26, 1980.

EMPLOYEE HEALTH UPDATE

ILLNESS

Employees becoming ill while on duty should notify their supervisor or department head and report to Employee Health, 7A19. If no one is in the Employee Health Office, the employee should then report to the Emergency Room and identify theirself as an A&SHHC employee.

Any Emergency Room or physician charges resulting from that visit to the E.R. or Employee Health Office will not be billed to the employee. However, the employee will be billed for any ancillary services (x-rays, lab studies) required. Services will be referred to the insurance company for consideration.

INJURY

If injured while on duty, the employee should report to the Employee Health Office. If the Office is not open, the employee should report to the Emergency Room for evaluation and treatment.

No charges will be made to the employee for these services or for any followup care by either an Emergency Room physician or referral physician if ordered by an E.R. physician.

No matter how minor the injury, an incident report must be filled out within 48 hours of the injury. Department Head or immediate supervisor must also be notified of the injury.

Any injuries occurring at home will not be considered "on duty" emergencies and the employee is liable for this treatment.
