This interactive in-room TV system helps patients and their loved ones get more involved in their care by providing access to educational videos, information about campus services and amenities, and ondemand entertainment.

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Benefits of the LVHN Patient TV

- It gives patients 24/7 access to informative information about their care.
- The system provides on-demand movies as well as relaxation, music and spiritual content.
- Patients can provide real-time feedback to members of their care team.
- Patients have better outcomes because the education they receive allows more active participation in their care.


It's already being used. In fact, from April through December 2019:

- There have been 344 LVHN Behavioral Health app downloads.
- The LVHN Behavioral Health app was accessed 3,387 times.
- The top-viewed resources were related to transcending anxiety and stress management.
