Terry's Take: Giving Thanks All Year Round

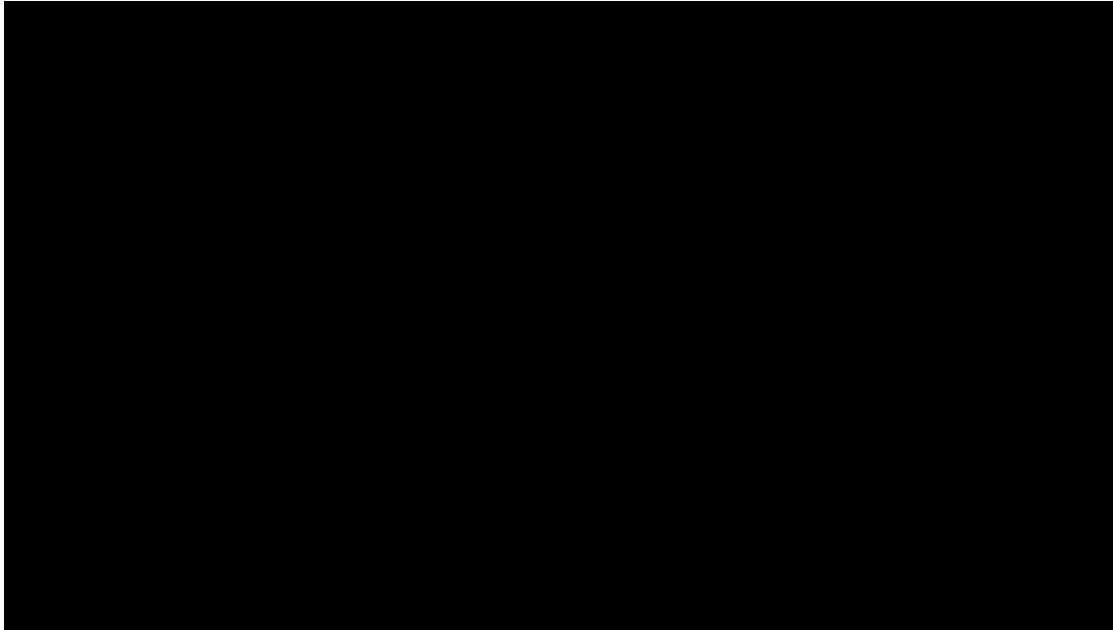

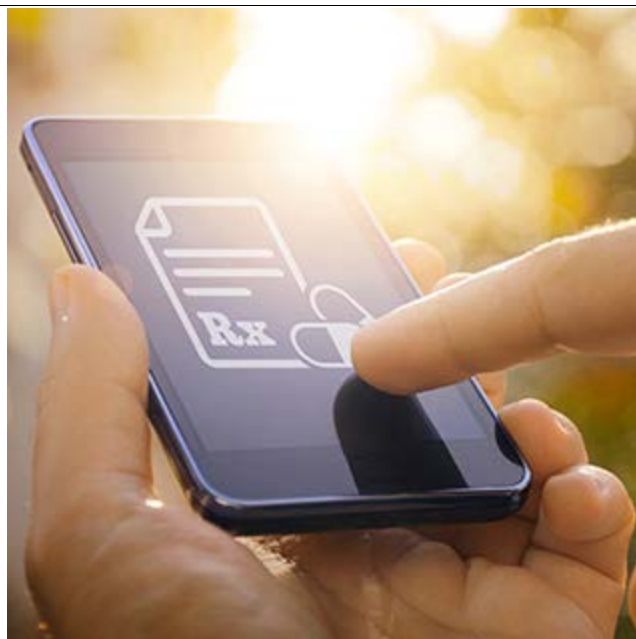
Easy Refill Options from Health Spectrum Pharmacy Services

- Pick up at the Health Spectrum Pharmacy Services location of your choice, or have it mailed to your home for free.



2. Order your refill from the mobileRx® app.

- Go to Apple App Store or Google Play.
- Search for MobileRx Pharmacy and choose the app from J M Smith Corporation.
- Download
- Open the app.

3. Ship your Rx for free* with Convenience Shipping.

- Enroll using the Convenience Shipping form found on LVHN.org/pharmacy.
- Once enrolled, you may request your medications to be shipped through our website, the mobileRx app, or by using our Interactive Voice Response System.
- Place your order(s).
- You will receive an email confirming your order along with a tracking number.

Don't Lose Your 2016 FSA Dollars

Remember that contributions to your Flexible Spending Account (FSA) must be used for services received within the calendar year.

To use your remaining 2016 FSA dollars, you must incur qualified expenses by Dec. 31, 2016. While you have until March 31, 2017 to claim reimbursement for those expenses, any funds unused by Dec. 31 will be forfeited. Also, 2017 funds cannot be used for 2016 expenses.

Populytics recently partnered with FSA Store, the only e-commerce site exclusively stocked with FSA-eligible products and services. FSA Store eliminates the



guesswork behind what is reimbursable under your FSA. You can access the site easily once you've logged into MyPopulytics.com. Simply click on WealthCARE FSA & HSA Account under the "Quick Links" menu just as you would check your FSA balance. Then click on FSA STORE at the bottom left side of the page.

Keep in mind that incurring expenses is not the same as submitting a claim. In order to be reimbursed with 2016 funds, claims must be submitted to Populytics by **March 31, 2017**.

Beth Tomlinson first met Nassir at Roosevelt Elementary School. Then a fourth grader at the South Allentown school, Nassir was on stage serving as emcee for the school's Leadership Day in front of a crowd of 200 teachers, parents and community members. Nassir interacted with the audience, introduced a student orchestra and other acts, and told jokes to keep the program moving. His confidence was remarkable for a boy his age.

"Nassir is an example of the exceptional students in our Community Schools," says Tomlinson, Assistant Director of Education, United Way of the Greater Lehigh Valley. "He embodies what all kids are capable of – their dreams and aspirations for a brighter future."

Nassir is one of thousands of students served by the United Way of the Greater Lehigh Valley. He represents what the nonprofit seeks to achieve in 14 Community Schools in Allentown, Bethlehem, Easton and Bangor. Below, watch a video of Nassir to learn about Community Schools.

The Community School program helps children develop the skills they need to achieve their dreams.

"We're creating a space where we can see, respect and feed the curiosity, talents and confidence of students so they can dream big and achieve," Tomlinson says. "Nassir is one example of the power, eloquence, compassion, generosity and talent of our students."

Community Schools are driven by six tenets – principles that work together to create a positive and safe learning environment where parents feel welcome and children can thrive.

They include:

1. Maintain a safe school environment.
2. Meet each family's basic needs through food, clothing, physical and behavioral health services.
3. Connect youth with quality early learning opportunities such as quality pre-school, child care, and summer kindergarten readiness programs like Kinder Camp.
4. Provide rigorous and engaging instruction.
5. Empower parents and caregivers to become partners in their child's education.
6. Engage youth in before- and after-school opportunities with positive adult mentors and role models.

Empowering parents and children

Among the programs at Roosevelt Elementary is Book Blast, an evening program that helps families become more confident learners, develop better literacy skills and create a space for learning at home. Each time families attend Book Blast, their children go home with free books that help build a home library and encourage family reading.

Cooking Matters is an after-school program that pairs adult mentors with students to help them learn about nutrition and preparing healthy meals at home.

“Our before- and after-school programs create high expectations for students,” says Tomlinson. “Adult volunteers provide mentoring and academic support through tutoring, and kids get leadership opportunities and healthy meals to help them succeed.”

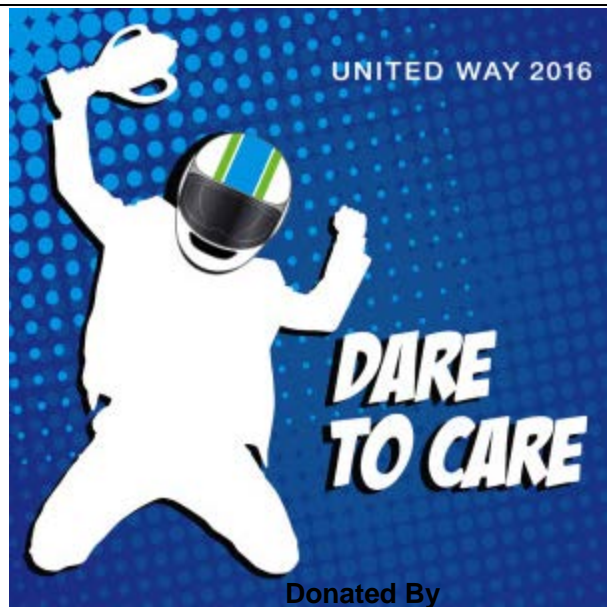
