NEW CODING SYSTEM IN USE

A few months ago, several employees of the Medical Records Department attended a two-day workshop in order to familiarize themselves with a new coding system — International Classification of Diseases, Ninth Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-9-CM).

In January, the state health department and the U.S. Public Health Service began using the ICD-9-CM for official statistical reporting purposes. This new coding system will be used by hospitals and other health care providers in coding and reporting clinical information as required for participation in various government programs such as Medicare, Medicaid, and PSRO.

In addition, ICD-9-CM will code and tabulate clinical data from medical records for a variety of other inhouse activities, such as in planning and medical care evaluation. Furthermore, the ICD-9-CM will provide physicians with more specific technical data concerning classification of death, morbidity, and disabilities.


