CIRCUMCISION AT HOSPITAL.

For the first time in the history of the Allentown Hospital, the rite of circumcision was performed, on Monday, when Rabbi Hyman Friedman, of the Congregation Sons of Israel performed the rite on the infant son of Joseph Richman, of this city. The child was born at the Hospital a week ago, and the rite was witnessed by Chief Surgeon Dr. C. D. Schaeffer, the internes and an attending nurse, besides the parents. The operation was characterized as a success by the hospital physicians, who spoke highly of it.
