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
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Role of Navigation

- Conduct nursing assessment of patient and family needs; identification of barriers to care
- Provide education and emotional support
- Facilitate communication through medical interpretation and navigation support between patient, family, and healthcare providers
- Coordination among medical team: Social Worker, Clinical Dietitian, Clinical Trials Nurses, Oncology Nurses, Palliative Medicine, Survivorship, etc.
- Provide supportive care throughout the cancer continuum
- Referrals within network
 - Genetics
 - Cancer Support Services counseling
 - Financial Coordinator
- Link to Community Resources
 - American Cancer Society
 - Cancer Support Community
 - Leukemia & Lymphoma Society
 - Cancer Care
- Cancer Fund of America, Inc.
- Latino counseling services




Benefits of Patient Navigation

- Increased adherence to plan of care
- Improve patient outcomes, decrease patient (and family) distress, and reduce financial stress on the healthcare system (Koh, Nelson, & Cook,, 2011; Campbell, Craig, Eggert & Bailey-Dorton, 2010; Swanson & Koch, 2010, Dohan & Schrag, 2005).
