Elliot Sussman, M.D., has been elected chairman of the board and president of the PennCARESM integrated delivery system. Other board officers are Thomas Hansen, secretary (also senior vice president, LVHHN) and Robert Bauer, treasurer (also vice president, finance, Doylestown Hospital).

Irwin Greenberg, chairman of the board of trustees, announces that by unanimous vote, the board has asked Sussman to remain at the helm of LVHHN for at least five more years, and that he has formally agreed.

Competitors' News

The Lehigh Valley Controllers Group report on hospitalization use for July-Dec. 1994 and 1995 shows a decrease of .2 percent in total inpatient admissions for all reporting hospitals (LVH, Sacred Heart, St. Luke's, Muhlenberg, AOMC, Gnaden Huetten). During this period, admissions at LVH decreased 4.2 percent while St. Luke's saw a 3.3 percent increase, and AOMC had a 4.3 percent rise. According to Elliot Sussman, M.D., "As managed care takes root, a more fitting focus for our efforts is how many covered lives we enroll. Our inpatient admissions should continue to drop as we keep people healthy and treat patients more appropriately in outpatient settings."
