# GREATER BETHLEHEM BILL SIGNED FRIDAY BY THE GOVERNOR

(By Associated Press.)
Harrisburg, May 25—The governor
to-day signed the Schantz "Greater
Bethlehem" bill for the amalgamation
of Bethlehem, South Bethlehem and

adjacent communities.

Governor Brumbaugh signed the senate bill providing that applicants for state medical licenses must have completed not less than one year as an interne in an approved hospital, providing for field service and military medicine requirements and clarifying clauses relative to provocation of licenses.

Other bills approved were:

Senate bills regulating packing of apples, requiring marking and grading and providing that exposed surface of packed apples "shall fairly represent the average of the apples in the package."

House bills requiring drivers of motor vehicles who injure any person to return and give assistance under penalty of fine of not over \$500 or not over

one year in prison.

House bill authorizing fire insurance companies to "make insurance against loss or damage caused by bombardment, invasion, insurrection, riot, civil war, damage by military or usurped power."

Also the following senate bills:

Raising the pay of subordinate assessors in Allegheny from \$4 to \$5 per day.

Providing that prison boards may fix the place of residence of wardens.

Regulating payment of taxes by tenants or partners in common.
