**Captain Schaadt Sends \$25 and Mrs. Schaadt \$10.**

This week the "Morning Call" reminded subscribers to the fund started in 1891 for the Allentown Hospital that now was an appropriate time to pay in the money, as the building was nearing completion and the money was needed. The following letter is self explanatory and shows responses to the amount of \$35. Let others follow suit:

ALLENTOWN, February 3, 1899.

Dear Sir:—The editorial in the "Call" of yesterday on the Allentown Hospital reminds me that quite a long time ago I subscribed \$25 to the hospital building fund originated by your paper, which I have not yet paid, as no one has called for it. At the same time Mrs. Schaadt subscribed \$10. I now beg to enclose you my personal check, No. 2499, for \$25, as well as Mrs. Schaadt's check, No. 751, for \$10, to cover these two subscriptions.
