The Allentown Hospital Remembered.

Register Smith admitted to probate the last will and testament of the late Barbara Schaadt who died recently at Schaadt's P. O., and in it the Allentown Hospital and a large number of friends are remembered. She divides her fancy work and books among her cousins, Mrs. Lucy B. Savage, Maplewood, Mass; Fannie Van Kleck, Santa Cruz, Cal; Mrs. C. M. Johnson, Short Hills, N. J.; Mrs. J. L. Schaadt and Mrs. Tillie Hinkle, Allentown; Mrs. Alice Hermany, Catasauqua and her friends; Clara Erdman, Macungie; Ida V. Balliet, Orefield; Emma Bogh, Macungie; Mrs. Sue Falk, Balliettsville, and Misses Sadie and Minnie V. George, of Ruchsville. Her wardrobe she orders to be divided between her sisters, Mrs. Alice Erdman, of Allentown, and Mrs. Rosa George, of Ruchsville.

The balance of her estate is to be converted into cash, one half of which she bequeaths to the Allentown Hospital and the other half to her executor in trust for her brother, Alfred D. Schaadt, of Steinman, Ore., and after his death the principal is to go to the Allentown Hospital.

J. L. Schaadt, Esq., is appointed executor of the will, which was executed January 11, 1893. The witnesses were V. D. Barner and Jesse S. Keck. The decedent formerly lived at the Grand Central Hotel in this city.
