## JOHN SIEGER'S PUTZ.

**It Will be the Most Magnificent He Ever Made.**

The home of John J. Sieger, the painter, of No. 216 North Sixth street, was visited by a MORNING CRITIC man last evening, who was shown the elegant Christmas putz that Mr. Sieger is putting up for the entertainment of the public.

Mr. Sieger has always had the reputation of preparing fine putzes, but the one of this year will eclipse all former efforts. Many new ideas and attractions await those whose pleasure it will be to witness it. No admission will be charged. Everybody will be welcome. THE MORNING CRITIC has been allowed the privilege of placing a box in the room for voluntary contributions to the hospital fund.

A full description will be given later. The putz must be seen to be appreciated. Those who have contributed to make the putz a success will be mentioned later. The public will be admitted on Christmas evening after 7 o'clock, on the following day at 2 in the afternoon and in the evening and thereafter evenings until New Year's. Much credit is due Mr. Sieger, whose labors are gratuitously rendered, and who is anxious to see THE MORNING CRITIC hospital fund increased.
