The Conductors and Motormen
Contribute \$116.71 to the

"Morning Call" Hospital Fund--The
Profits of the Ball Which Was
Given Last Year--Another
Ball To-night.

Motorman D. R. Faust and Conductor E. J. Kurtz, of the Traction Company, yesterday informed the editor of the MORNING CALL that this morning the sum of \$116.17 would be turned over to the MORNING CALL Hospital Fund. The money was realized from the ball given by the motormen and conductors of the Traction Company a year ago.

This sum, coming as it does right after the handsome contribution of the silk workers of the Adelaide mill, will give the fund another impetus. It should serve to awaken new interest in the project and cause others to make special efforts to do something substantial for the fund.

The contribution is given with the understanding that if the hospital is not erected the money is to be returned to the motormen and conductors of the Traction Company.

To-night the motormen and conductors will hold their annual ball at Central Park pavilion. These annual balls have become very popular and efforts have been made to make this year's event the most successful and enjoyable of any yet held. The affair is in the hands of a competent Committee of Arrangements and nothing has been overlooked which will tend to contribute to the enjoyment of those who attend.
