The citizens of Allentown who feel an interest in the establishing of a hospital in this city are hereby invited and requested to attend a meeting to be held in the Grand Jury room in the Court House THIS EVENING, the 17th inst., at 8 o'clock, for the purpose of discussing the matter freely and considering the merits of plans which will be suggested for placing the project before our people in a definite shape. It is the intention not to ask for any subscriptions at this meeting, but merely to learn if there is a strong enough feeling in favor of a hospital to warrant an active movement to establish one. A large attendance is earnestly desired. This call is made by request.
