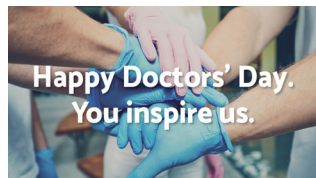

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LVHN Announces New COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Locations and New Dates for Pocono Raceway and Dorney Park Mass Vaccination Drive-Through Events



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Those eligible to receive their first dose can do so by appointment only

Lehigh Valley, Pa., March 30, 2021

As part of [Lehigh Valley Health Network's \(LVHN\)](#) commitment to vaccinate the most people possible, the health network is opening two new vaccination locations and hosting two more drive-through vaccination clinics. With these expanded efforts, LVHN expects to deliver up to 35,000 doses per week.

New Clinic Locations Announced

LVHN will be transitioning the Lehigh Valley Hospital (LVH)—Cedar Crest and LVH—Muhlenberg clinics to two new, larger locations in the Lehigh Valley that will complement the network's robust vaccination efforts throughout the region. In Lehigh County, LVHN is opening a COVID-19 vaccination clinic at the former AC Moore store, 2633 MacArthur Blvd., Whitehall. Another vaccination clinic will be located in Northampton County at Northampton Crossings shopping center in the former Sears Appliance and Hardware store, 3768 Easton Nazareth Highway, Palmer Township. Both locations open April 12 and will provide COVID-19 vaccinations by appointment only.

Additional Drive-Through Events

Leading up to the opening of these vaccination sites, LVHN will also be holding two mass vaccination drive-through events at [Pocono Raceway](#) and [Dorney Park](#). These events will deliver a total of 7,000 first doses.

The first will be held at Pocono Raceway in Long Pond, Pa., on Wednesday, April 7, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On this date, we expect to administer 3,000 first doses of the Moderna vaccine.

The following Saturday, April 10, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., LVHN plans to vaccinate 4,000 people with their first dose of the Moderna vaccine at Dorney Park & Wildwater Kingdom in Allentown, Pa.

Both drive-through vaccination events are available for those eligible to receive a vaccine. An appointment is required to receive the vaccine at all LVHN drive-through

clinics and vaccination sites.

In addition to these locations, vaccine appointments continue to be available at [Lehigh Valley Hospital \(LVH\)–Pocono](#), [LVH–Hazleton](#) and [LVH–Schuylkill](#).

To schedule an appointment for any LVHN COVID-19 vaccination event including drive-through clinics, people in Phase 1A can sign in to MyLVHN, the health network's patient portal. You also can schedule an appointment by calling our **COVID-19 Vaccine Hotline at 833-584-6283**, [📞 \(833-LVHN-CVD\)](#). However, because of large demand and call volume, you may be on hold. MyLVHN will be your fastest and easiest way to schedule.

LVHN is committed to administering the vaccine as quickly as possible to those who are eligible at the time. LVHN will cover all costs. The LVHN plan for administering COVID-19 vaccines is determined by the Pennsylvania Department of Health's [phased approach](#) to vaccination.

The best thing you can do to preregister for vaccination is to create a [MyLVHN](#) account. You'll be notified when you are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine and can schedule your vaccine appointment on MyLVHN.

Even after receiving the COVID-19 vaccine, people must continue to wear a mask in public, wash hands frequently and stay socially distant until the majority of our community is vaccinated.

LVHN colleagues in the Lehigh Valley now have the option of a virtual return to work clearance appointment, eliminating the need for some to have an in-person visit with Employee Health. Visits will be with nurses and are available to those who have been cleared by their physician to return to work full duty (with no restrictions). Those that are cleared to return to work with restrictions also may be scheduled for a virtual appointment with the employee health provider, if appropriate, to determine their ability

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to return to work with those restrictions.

A smart device is preferred to connect to virtual visits, and an email account is required. Directions to install the app used for virtual visits will be emailed. To schedule your virtual visit, call 610-402-1894

While virtual visits are currently only open to colleagues in the Lehigh Valley, there are plans to expand the program to other regions.

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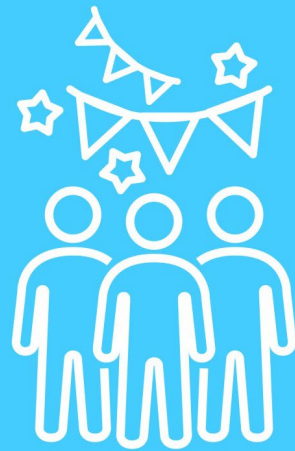

Blue skies, sunshine and mild temperatures greeted thousands of people who got their first COVID-19 vaccine shot on Saturday. It was the first COVID-19 mass vaccination

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clinic for [Northampton County](#), but nothing new for Lehigh Valley Health Network (LVHN).

Three thousand eager people turned out and rolled up their sleeves to receive the Moderna vaccine at a drive-through clinic on the campus of [Northampton Community College \(NCC\)](#), Bethlehem Township.

“We are excited to expand our mass vaccinations to Northampton County,” says Terry Burger, RN, who serves as Incident Commander. “The people being vaccinated here seem very happy, and those helping us are so enthusiastic and excited it makes for a great day.”

LVHN is vaccinating under [Pennsylvania's Phase 1A](#) and is committed to providing vaccines as efficiently and quickly as possible. All COVID-19 vaccines provided by LVHN are free.

As those getting shots relaxed for a 15-minute post-vaccine period, they offered thanks to LVHN. “It was so smooth,” community member David Stewart says. “We do appreciate this and hope everyone stays safe as possible.”

Other attendees, Beth and her 88-year-old mother Phyllis of Bethlehem, say they are thankful for the drive-through because of the convenience and ease in getting through. “It’s so organized. It was done so well,” Beth says. “Everyone was so nice. LVHN made it easy.”

In addition to the NCC mass vaccination, LVHN has conducted drive-through mass vaccination clinics at Dorney Park and Pocono Raceway. Just last week, LVHN introduced its COVID-19 mobile vaccination fleet unit to reach large concentrations of people eligible for the vaccine but unable to get to hospitals or drive-through clinics. Already, the units have been operational in Carbon, Luzerne and Schuylkill counties and throughout the Lehigh Valley. The fleet of three vehicles was made possible by a partnership with Bennett Toyota, Allentown. Daily vaccine clinics continue to be offered at all LVHN hospitals, as well. Appointments are required.

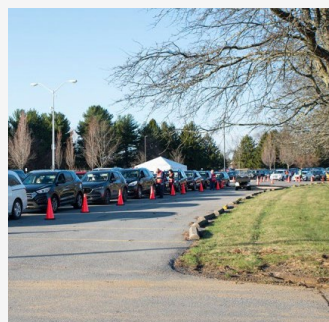

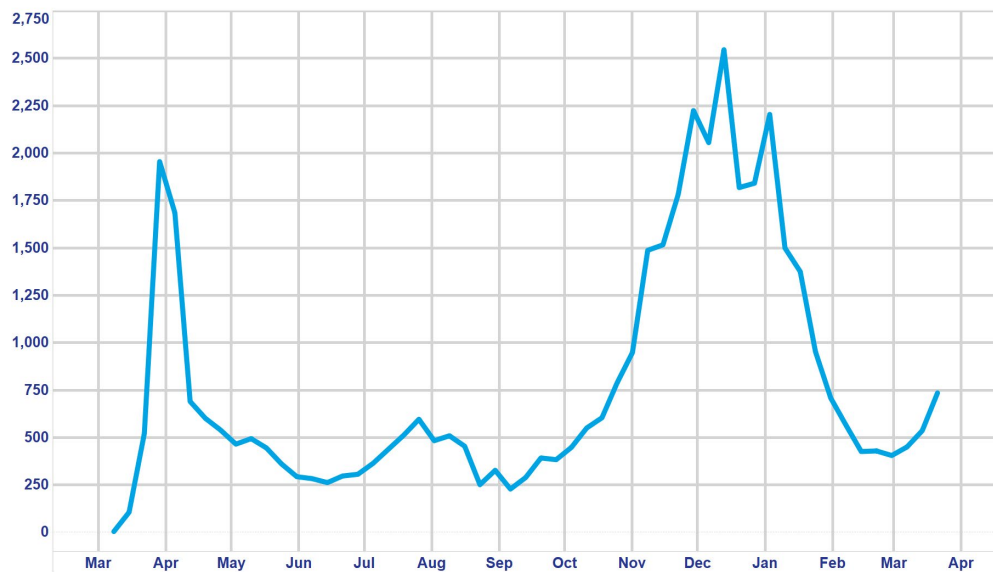

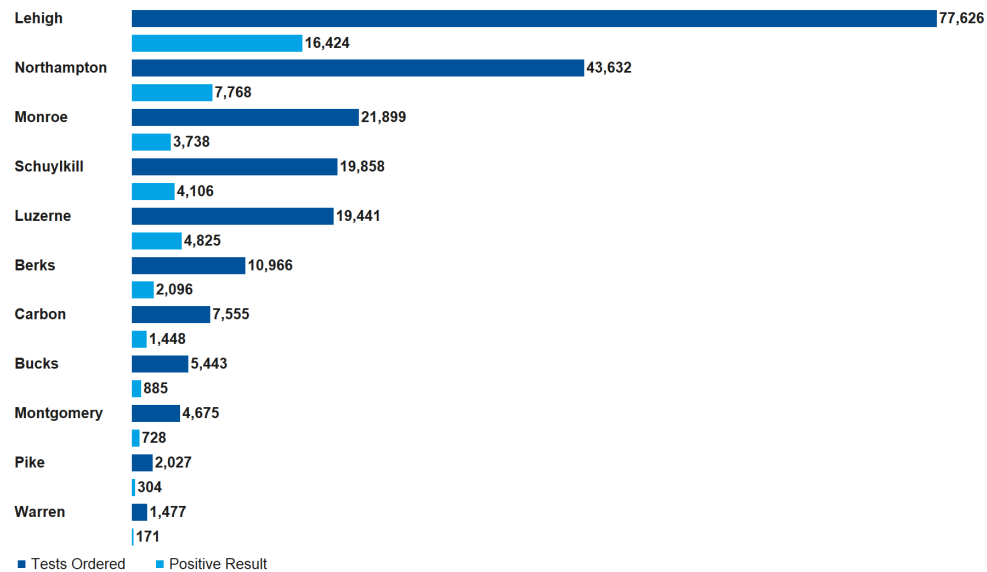
Weekly Positive Test Results
