The make-up of Noll's team is as follows: Roth, centre, 156; Noll, right guard, 154; McGee, left guard, 158; Gregg, right tackle, 140; Banghart, left tackle, 162; Phil King, right end, 174; Wetherhold, left end, 162; Brown, quarter, 158; O'Donnell, right half back, 152; Gallagher, left half back, 162; Doyle, full back, 180; substitutes, Reese, 148; Boyd, 160; Jones, 172; McCarthy, 168.

Both clubs have been in training for some time, and though it will hardly be a U. P. and Harvard game, some genuine sport is looked for. The make-up of both sides is good and there is considerable interest manifested as to the outcome. Last evening Menninger's club held a secret practice in Turner Hall.
