Passion, Purpose and Professional Identity

Over the past 20 years, my clinical practice has changed from that of a general obstetriciangynecologist to a specialist, of sorts, caring for patients with chronic pelvic pain. I didn't train specifically for this role, or even purposefully choose it. It evolved. Initially, I felt there was a need to centralize the care of chronic pelvic pain patients. In typical medical communities these patients were being passed between providers who meant well but were unable to provide consistent continuity of care. At the same time, I found the pathophysiology of chronic pain conditions to be intriguing. Physical exams and diagnostic workups often didn't clearly explain the symptoms – but the symptoms are clearly real.

On a concrete level, there are many elements of caring for chronic pelvic pain that I enjoy and about which I am passionate. I have the opportunity to perform a variety of procedures in the office and in the operating room that satisfy my technical and surgical passions. As a provider at Lehigh Valley Health Network, I am able to provide exceptional,

collaborative, team-based care that is critical to successfully managing this patient population. Specifically, I have access to gifted specialists, leading-edge technology and critical ancillary service lines. Chronic pelvic pain management is also an opportunity for me to care for the patient as a whole as we focus on organic disease processes, which often involve multiple organ systems, and also the pertinent psychological and social aspects of care. Through taking care of my patients, I've learned that validating and caring for patients is often more important than curing and alleviating their pain.

On a more abstract level, there are other aspects of managing patients with chronic pelvic pain that drive me. These facets of care provide me with a true sense of meaning and joy, and inspire me to be the best doctor I can be, day in and day out. Caring for patients with pelvic pain provides me with a sense of purpose.

Purpose is defined as the reason for which something is done or created or for which something exists. It is why we do what we do. We as caregivers have a purpose and commitment to service and we typically find a profound feeling of privilege in our work. When we applied to medical or professional school, and then later when we chose a specialty, we completed a personal statement that was in effect our purpose statement. As was the case with

me, purpose may evolve during our careers. In fact, a new area of exploration in medical training involves a concept called Professional Identity Formation. Curricula on Professional Identity Formation aim to help clinicians really figure out their core values, establish moral principles and master self-awareness.¹ Professional identity formation training has also been shown to promote self-reflection, emphasize the significant role of relationships (patients and peers), nurture mindfulness and enforce the value of creating collaborative learning environments.² Although these programs may be focused upon during medical training, I believe we must continuously take inventory of our purpose – who we are, what we want to be – and recognize what keeps us energized and healthy clinicians.

I am thankful to be a physician who cares for patients with chronic pelvic pain. I feel grateful to have the ability to help them whether it involves curing their pain or simply caring for and supporting them if they are suffering. Although demanding at times, I realize the challenge is also what drives and inspires me to become better at what I do and makes being a chronic pain physician, in effect, my calling. This is my passion, purpose and professional identity.

Family Birth and Newborn Center at LVH–Muhlenberg Opens This Summer

The Family Birth and Newborn Center at Lehigh Valley Hospital (LVH)–Muhlenberg is scheduled to open in Summer 2017. This ultramodern obstetrical unit includes eight labor and delivery rooms, five triage rooms and four antepartum rooms on the second floor. A 10-bed neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) and a 20-bed postpartum mother-baby unit occupy the third floor. All rooms are private, including private NICU beds. The professional care team includes maternal fetal medicine (MFM) specialists, obstetricians, midwives, advanced practice clinicians, pediatricians, family medicine physicians, neonatologists, and obstetrical, pediatric and neonatal nurses.

The care team at the Family Birth and Newborn Center has the expertise and technology to provide state-of-theart personalized, patient-centered care for a wide spectrum of patients who often present with an extensive range of medical needs and personal choices. Mothers who choose to labor naturally will be supported by nurses with expertise in various low interventional techniques including position changes, birthing balls and hot tubs. Mothers with most high-risk conditions will have easy access to the technology and specialty professional support from MFM, neonatology and anesthesia.

The Level II NICU at LVH–Muhlenberg can provide care to neonates born at 32 weeks. Moms with select very high-risk medical/obstetrical conditions and babies with select complex conditions will be cared for and delivered at LVH–Cedar Crest, where they will have immediate round-the-clock access to MFM physicians and all of the pediatric specialists, technology and pediatric operating rooms within the Children's Hospital.

Lehigh Valley Health Network (LVHN) is expecting more than 1,000 deliveries at the Family Birth and Newborn Center in the first year. Many of these patients live in Northampton County. In addition to the Lehigh Valley Physician Group (LVPG) OB/GYN practices at Valley Center Parkway and West Broad Street in Bethlehem, LVHN is opening three new locations in June including a medical office building at Madison Farms in Bethlehem Township, the Health Center at Palmer Township and the Health Center at Easton. Also, LVPG Family Medicine locations across the region are open to new pediatric patients.

Now Available at All Campuses: MedAbbrev and Lexicomp

With more than more than 47,000 entries, MedAbbrev is the official reference for abbreviations and acronyms not listed on the commonly used abbreviation list. The MedAbbrev program home page has been customized to display the Lehigh Valley Health Network (LVHN) list of Do Not Use abbreviations. Five users can access the resource simultaneously.

Abbreviations in the official reference, MedAbbrev (Neil M. Davis Medical Abbreviations), or included in the facilityspecific abbreviation list, may be used when documenting in health care records. For the Lehigh Valley Hospital (LVH)–Cedar Crest and LVH–Muhlenberg campuses, facility-specific abbreviations can be found in Policy Tech in the Medical Abbreviations policy in the Administrative Manual.

Access MedAbbrev at LVH–Cedar Crest and LVH–Muhlenberg through the Library Services home page, which is listed in the WebLinks in Epic and on the intranet home page under the Educational Resources category on the right side of the screen. Lexicomp is the LVHN standard point of care pharmacology reference for prescription and OTC drug information, lab and diagnostic procedures, diseases and conditions, and patient education on medications. The program includes formulary monographs, facts and comparisons, Trissel's IV Check, drug comparisons, Martindale Drug Reference, drug interactions, pediatric drugs, drug identification, IV compatibility, toxicology, and pregnancy and lactation content. On-site access and a mobile app are available to staff at all campuses.
