HOMŒOPATHS SATISFIED

**Rev. Dr. Singmaster Explained
Matters Fully to Them.**

**He Told the New School Physicians
That the Proposed Hospital Was
Intended for the People and
Not for the Doctors.**

The Homoeopathic physicians have been appeased in regard to the hospital matters. Rev. Dr. J. A. Singmaster, President of the Hospital Association, met them and explained that no effort has been made or contemplated to exclude anybody. He said the hospital was for the people and not for the doctors. He also stated that the association was not committed to either side and it never was the intention that any one wanting Homoeopathic treatment should not receive it.

Dr. Singmaster then suggested that the following amendment be made to the ordinance providing for the sale of the city's reservoir site to the association for \$1: "Provided that the Trustees of the said Allentown Hospital Association shall not employ the physicians of either one of the schools of medicine, Allopathic or Homoeopathic, to the exclusion of the other, but shall offer to patients, as far as practicable, treatment by the school of their choice."

This was satisfactory to the Homoeopaths, who will not press their protest against the ordinance. The matter now lies entirely with Councils.
