NEEDLEWORK GUILD.

The Allentown Branch Held a Meeting in Y. M. C. A. Hall Yesterday.

The Allentown Branch of the Needlework Guild of America held a meeting in Y. M. C. A. Hall rooms yesterday afternoon for the purpose of reorganization. Miss Marion Bear and Miss Clymer, of Reading, made addresses. The branch was organized with ten sectional branches, each having a membership of fifty, with a President and five Directors. The branch proper elected the following officers to serve the ensuing year: Honorary President, Mrs. Robert Wright; President, Miss Mary L. Romig; Secretary. Mrs. Dr. H. H. Herbst; Treasurer, Mrs. H. Hudders.

The Allentown branch has been organized for three years and during that time its members have made and distributed between 1200 and 1300 garments among the worthy poor of the city. In the event of the city securing a hospital the ladies propose donating part of their work towards the institution. The Presidents of the sectional branches are Mrs. Mary Romig, Miss Carrie Wright, Mrs. Mary Young, Miss Eliza Keck, Mrs. H. Hudders, Mrs. T. H. Diehl, Mrs. Hannah Hunt, Mrs. Harry C. Trexier, Mrs. Samuel A. Butz. The remaining branch is composed of the King's Daughters Circles.
