## EVERYTHING IN READINESS

For the Grand Concert for the Benefit of the Hospital This Evening  
—Mr. Gossler and Mr. Shimer's Good Work.

Last evening the last rehearsals prior to this evening's concert were held by the Oratorio Society, Euterpean Club and Allentown Band. At the Oratorio rehearsal in the Y. M. C. A. Hall. There was a full representation of the society and the entire program was gone over and well rendered. After the rehearsal was over the Euterpean Club rehearsed at their rooms.

The Allentown Band has been practicing every possible evening for the last few weeks and last evening's rehearsal brought forth everything in first-class order. There are a number of quite new selections on the program and those attending the concert will be treated to one of the finest concerts they ever heard.

John Gossler and Hiram Shimer were busy yesterday calling upon the businessmen on Hamilton street. In the afternoon they disposed of 84 tickets. This was good work for half a day, yet there are lots of tickets that are not yet taken. There will be room for all to-night, and none should make the excuse that they are afraid they can get no seats

The Oratorio Society will be in Market Hall first and the band in the Academy. In order that it may be fully understood this explanation is made: The price for admission to the concert will be \$1. This admits the bearer either to Market Hall or the Academy. The Oratorio Society, Euterpean Club and band will go from one building to the other to render their selections. The program rendered in one house will be the same rendered in the other. Let there be a good attendance to-night. The cause is a worthy one and the concert will amply repay those attending.
