

What You Need to Know About Beneficiaries

Learn why it's important to designate a beneficiary and how to update your retirement plan.

LVHN Insider Tuesday, October 4, 2022 Who, or what, is a beneficiary?

A beneficiary is the person or entity you designate to receive the proceeds (death benefit) from your life insurance policy, annuity or other financial contract (including money left over in your retirement plan account). The beneficiary can be a family member, friend, trust, business organization or charity — and you can name one person, several people or a combination of people and entities.

Get specific

Designate both a "primary" and "contingent" beneficiary. That way, if the primary beneficiary dies before you do, your designated assets will be paid to the contingent beneficiary.

Note: It is important to keep in mind that any beneficiary you name as part of your retirement plan documents will override what may be in your estate documents (if a difference exists).

What if you don't designate a beneficiary?

If you haven't named a beneficiary, the death benefit will likely be paid directly to your estate. In that case, a lengthy probate process could delay distribution of the proceeds of your estate — and probate costs could reduce the amount of the money you meant to go to your heirs.

You may need to make changes

Changes in your life situation (marriage, divorce, the birth or adoption of a child) may cause you to change your initial selection. It is important to review your beneficiary designations regularly to make sure your choices are still appropriate and current.

To designate a beneficiary or to make updates, login to your online account at <u>lvhn.aigrs.com</u>. If you have not yet registered for online account access, select "Register" and follow the prompts.

The pop-up vaccine clinics will welcome walk-ins. No appointment is needed. Colleagues should bring proof of prior vaccination, if applicable.

The Pfizer-BioNTech bivalent vaccine booster and the Moderna bivalent COVID-19 vaccine booster will be available.

The newest Pfizer-BioNTech booster vaccine is authorized for those 12 and older for use as a single booster dose at least two months following primary or booster vaccination with the original vaccine formulation.

The new Moderna booster vaccine is authorized for those 18 and older for use as a single booster dose at least two months following primary or booster vaccination with the original vaccine formulation.

Protect Yourself and Others by Getting a Flu Shot

Fall is here, and you know what that means. Cold and flu season is coming. As flu season quickly approaches, all colleagues are reminded to get a flu shot as soon as possible this year.

When you get vaccinated early in the fall, you decrease your chances of getting the flu and transmitting it to our patients and visitors. Health care workers have a <u>special obligation to be</u>

<u>vaccinated</u>, because people who remain unvaccinated and spread the flu can cause serious harm to vulnerable patients.

LVHN makes it easy to get your shot

Colleague flu shot clinics begin Monday, Oct. 3, and continue through Saturday, Nov. 12.

Click below to get the schedule for your location. Print the schedule, post it in your area, get vaccinated and remind others to do the same.

While there are no scheduled colleague flu clinics after Saturday, Nov. 12, the flu vaccine will be available at employee health offices in the Lehigh Valley during walk-in hours and by appointment in Hazleton, Schuylkill and Pocono employee health offices until Dec. 1.

Colleagues: Get vaccinated by Dec. 1

Whether you provide direct patient care, work on site at an LVHN facility or are working remotely, all colleagues must follow the LVHN influenza vaccination policy and all colleagues are expected to receive a flu vaccination by Thursday, Dec. 1.

Colleagues and independent medical staff may request a medical or religious exemption. Nonemployed LVHN partners cannot request an exemption. Requiring all colleagues to get the COVID-19 and influenza vaccines will help ensure we provide the safest possible care to our patients and keep colleagues and community members safe.

Colleagues who join the health network will follow the LVHN vaccination policy and will be expected to receive a flu shot.

What you need to know about safety precautions

LVHN is taking extra measures to make sure our flu shot clinics are as safe as possible.

- Complete the Conversa COVID-19 screening the day of vaccination– This is a requirement for all colleagues, even if you work from home or do not have a shift scheduled for that day.
 - 1. Visit <u>https://clinic.conversahealth.com/conversation/MjIwLTM3OTI</u> or text lehigh to 83973.
- Fill out your consent form before arriving Prior to attending a flu shot clinic, you must complete the electronic consent form, which can be found in your TLC education bundle.
 - 1. Additionally, you can access the <u>electronic consent form</u> on the <u>Influenza</u> <u>Information intranet page</u>.
- Enhanced cleaning measures are used The LVHN team will take additional cleaning steps to ensure commonly touched surfaces are continually disinfected.
- **Distancing while you wait** LVHN has protocols in place to ensure lines flow smoothly while allowing people to be socially distant.

Vaccinations received outside of an LVHN flu shot clinic

If you receive a flu vaccination at an LVPG practice or ExpressCARE location, proof of vaccination will automatically transfer to your employee health medical record. If you receive a flu vaccination outside of an LVHN flu shot clinic, an ExpressCARE or LVPG practice, you must submit proof to employee health services. There are several ways to do this:

- Upload to the intranet This is the preferred method to submit proof of vaccination. On the LVHN intranet, go to Resources>>Employee>>Influenza information. Scroll to the forms section and click "Submit Your Flu Proof Here."
- Send an email You may also send proof via email to Employee Health FluProofs@lvhn.org.
- If you are unable to submit proof of vaccination electronically, you may fax your documentation to 610-402-1203. Make sure your name is clearly written on the document along with another unique identifier such as your SUI.

Get your flu shot as soon as possible

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommend everyone 6 months of age and older gets a flu vaccine every season. Vaccination to prevent influenza is particularly important for people who are at high risk of serious complications from influenza, including adults 65 and older, pregnant women, young children and people with chronic health problems.

It takes two weeks for protection from a flu vaccine to develop in the body, so be sure to get your flu shot as soon as it becomes available to you.

Since 2010, CDC estimates that flu has resulted in between 140,000 and 960,000 hospitalizations each year. Flu vaccine prevents tens of thousands of hospitalizations each year. Just like COVID-19, influenza is a virus spread from person to person. While our community is experiencing a pandemic, it's more important than ever to do what you can to prevent the spread of infectious diseases. Health networks across the country already have limited resources due to COVID-19. A large flu outbreak could result in added strain on health systems.



mRNA Influenza Vaccine Research Study Opening at LVHN

Participating in the study will satisfy your 2022 colleague flu shot requirement.

LVHN Insider Friday, October 7, 2022 LVHN colleagues are invited to participate in a Pfizer study evaluating a new mRNA influenza vaccine.

The mRNA influenza vaccine was developed using the same technology used in mRNA COVID-19 vaccines, and phase I and II studies have shown that it is both safe and effective. This phase III study will compare the effectiveness of the mRNA vaccine to the traditional flu vaccine, and all participants will be given one of the two vaccines.

Because there is no placebo arm of this trial, participation will satisfy your 2022 colleague flu shot requirement.

More details about the study and how to enroll will be shared on LVHN Insider in the next few weeks.

Kiranpreet Khurana, MD, Designated as a Center of Excellence for Rezūm[™] Water Vapor Therapy

First female urologist in the country to be recognized for use of this treatment for benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH), or enlarged prostate

Boston Scientific announced that <u>Kiranpreet Khurana, MD</u>, <u>LVPG Urology</u>, has been designated as a Center of Excellence for RezūmTM Water Vapor Therapy treatment – a minimally invasive in-office procedure for men looking to treat their benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH), not just the symptoms. Rezūm Therapy uses natural water vapor to reduce the size of the prostate and provide lasting symptom-relief from BPH without invasive surgery or some of the potential side effects of prescription drugs. The Center of Excellence designation recognizes Khurana's high degree of experience with Rezūm Water Vapor Therapy and commitment to delivering significant, lasting symptom-relief to men suffering from BPH. She is the first female in the U.S. to be recognized as a Center of Excellence for Rezūm Therapy.

BPH is a condition in which a man's prostate enlarges and squeezes the urethra, causing frustrating symptoms such as frequent or urgent urination, a weak or interrupted urine stream, and the need to get up several times a night to urinate. It affects about 50% of men by age 60 and up to 90% of men by age 85.

"Being designated as a Rezūm Center of Excellence is a meaningful recognition for us, as we strive to provide the best possible treatment of urological conditions for our patients," Khurana said. "For years, the primary options for treating BPH were through behavior modifications, medications or invasive surgery. However, medications may not work for everyone and may have undesirable side effects such as dizziness, sexual dysfunction and lower sex drive. With Rezūm Therapy, we're able to provide relief of BPH for men who do not want to take medication or want to avoid invasive surgery and implants."

During Rezūm Therapy, which takes place during one short office visit, natural water vapor is released throughout the targeted prostate tissue. When the steam contacts the tissue and turns back to water, it releases energy, killing the excess prostate cells that squeeze the urethra. Over time, the body's natural healing response removes the dead cells and shrinks the prostate. With the extra tissue removed, the urethra opens, relieving BPH symptoms while preserving erectile and urinary function. The

procedure does not require general anesthesia and is performed under oral sedation or local anesthesia.

Rezūm Therapy has undergone extensive clinical trials to evaluate the safety and efficacy of the treatment. It is now included in the American Urological Association's BPH treatment guidelines and has four-year follow-up data showing its ability to treat prostates with hyperplasia of the central zone, lateral lobe and/or median lobe.



Over the past 10 years, Spirit Halloween has donated \$737,000 to our Children's Hospital. This has been used to purchase arts and crafts, gifts, dolls for educational purposes and KindVR headsets, which use virtual reality to help children relax during medical treatments. The funds have also been used to update the Children's Hospital's fish tank and bring sensory carts to inpatient areas.

The Spirit of Children program will also be hosting a Halloween party for the patients in the Children's Hospital. This party will include Halloween themed activities, games, and more than 100 costumes for the kids to choose from, all donated by Spirit Halloween.
