Another Object Lasson.

Again was the need of a hospital in this city demonstrated on Wednesday evening when William Hoffman was seriously injured by being struck by a train at Siegfried's and was brought to this city. In the first place, there was considerable delay before the injured man was put on a train to be brought to Allentown. The station at Seagfried's is not provided with a stretcher, something which every railway station should be compelled to have, and one had to be procured from the Lehigh Valley depot at Whitehall. After Mr. Hoffman was brought to this city ensiderable time was lost waiting for a train and he was finally taken to St-Luke's Hospital, South Bethlehlem. on the Terminal shifting engine.
