Annual Meeting of the Ladies' Auxiliary Held Yesterday.

NEW OFFICERS ELECTED

The Reports Show the Organization to be in a Prosperous Condition —The Amount of Money on Hand—Business Transacted.

The annual meeting of the Ladies' Auxillary of Hospital Association was held in Y M C A Hail at 2 p m yesterday. The pollowing officers were re-elected to serve the ensuing year: President, Mrs T H Diehl; first vice president, Mrs A E Leisenring; second vice president, Mrs W R Yeager; secretary, Mrs E M Stearns; treasurer, Mrs W P Huber.

The different annual reports were read, showing the association to be in a flourishing condition. The treasurer reports \$3380 30 on interest and \$275 95 cash on hand, having realized during the past eleven months \$3756 25. The association has a membership of 275.
