Early Action to be Taken.

Early action ~~will be taken~~ on the matter of the Allentown Hospital. The committee on plans, Hon. Edward F. Harvey, Dr. W. H. Hartzell and J. F. Hunsleker, will shortly decide on the plans for the main building of the hospital to be erected at Seventeenth and Chew streets. The report will be made either at a special meeting of the regular session of the board of trustees August 13. It is expected that between \$10,000 and \$15,000 will be expended in erecting the main building. The \$5000 appropriated by the state will be devoted altogether to maintenance. The Ladies' Auxiliary will hold a fair in fall to add a large sum to the fund now in the hands of Treasurer John E. Lentz. The lot, costing \$5000, is already paid for in full.
