NO CONCLUSION REACHED.

Hospital Trustees Considered Plans for the Buildings.

Rev. Dr. J. A. Singmaster, Rev. J. B. Maus, J. R. Gossler, J. F. Hunsicker, Dr. O. Fegley, Hon. Edward Harvey, Col. H. C. Trexler, H. S. Shimer and Dr. W. H. Hartzell, trustees of the Hospital Association, met yesterday afternoon to consider three plans for the hospital buildings offered by Seymour & Davis, of Philadelphia; Jacoby & Welshampel, of Allentown; and Mowbry & Uffinger, of New York.

The latter failed to offer a perspective and their plan was not considered.

The other two plans called for three parallel building with connections, that of the New York party having dormer roofs and pinnacles and that of the Allentown architects having flat roof, pinnacles and cupolas.

No conclusion was reached and action was postponed until a future meeting.
