THE LADIES' HOSPITAL AUXILIARY.

**It Has Done a Noble Work During the Year
Which Has Passed.**

The Ladies' Auxilliary of the Hospital Association met yesterday afternoon in St. Paul's Lutheran Church. The following officers were re-elected: Mrs. T. H. Diehl, president; Mrs. A. E. Leisenring, first vice president; Mrs. W. R. Yeager, second vice president; Mrs. E. M. Stearns, secretary; Mrs. Henry D. Hersh, treasurer. The latter was elected instead of Mrs. W. P. Huber, who declined re-election.

The report shows \$773.83 on hand. Last March they paid \$3894.50 on the lot. The women extended a vote of thanks to the city press, the Y. M. C. A. trustees and St. Paul's Church officers for favors shown. The women collected \$470 of the annual dues. Five new members were elected yesterday and their are now 303 members on the list.

The fair will be held from February 19 to 28 in Market Hall. There will be fourteen booths. The Allentown Band will play on the first evening and there will be music every evening. On the evening of Washington's birthday a "Martha Washington tea" will be held and an oyster supper will also be held on one evening. It is urged that the women of the city contribute liberally for the fair with fancy work, flowers refreshments, etc.
