The Ladies' Auxiliary of the Hospital Association Took Action Yesterday.

The Ladies' Auxiliary of the Allentown Hospital Association, at a meeting yesterday afternoon, passed a resolution offering their services for the caring of any sick members of Companies B and D who accompany their companies home. Several places have been promised to the ladies for their use as a temporary hospital and little difficulty will be experienced in procuring cots, medical attention, etc., for the soldiers. Mrs. R. S. Leisenring, Mrs. H. J. Ruhe and Mrs. A. P. Laubach, of Company, were appointed a committee to acquaint the mayor of their action. The latter promised to give them all the support he could and commended them for their foresight. While every effort is being made to give the returning soldiers a hearty welcome but little was thought of their possible medical needs. The good ladies of the hospital association auxiliary have, however, now assumed this work and the appreciation of the public should be shown in a generous and hearty manner.
