Bedclothing Needed.

Mrs. T. H. Diehl, president of the Ladies' Auxillary of the Allentown Hospital Association, of No. 111 North Eighth street, requests the "Morning Call" to state that the auxillary is in need of contributions of bedding, pillows, pillow cases, sheets and towels. The Allen Wheelmen have kindly donated the use of their gymnasium as a temporary hospital and fitted it up with cots for the use of the sick soldiers. Bedclothing is, however, very much needed. Private George Adams, of Lebanon, a recruit of Company B, was removed at noon yesterday to the temporary hospital suffering with symptoms of fever. Another soldier will be taken there to-day if his condition will permit his removal. Miss Bessie LaRoche, a trained nurse, has been employed by the ladies and is attending to the wants of the patients. The needs of bedding is urgent, and it is hoped that the response will be quick and generous.
