Act two consists of a colonial wedding and parasol dance and minuet, "Paul Revere's Ride," "Washington Crossing the Delaware," scarf dance, flag drill. Act 3: "Secession of the Southern States," "Tenting on the Old Camp Ground," "Colored Troops Under Captain Leisenring," "Dewey at Manila Bay" and flower dance.
