About the \$5000.

Yesterday morning Alderman Jones, of this city, received a letter from Major McCauley, the auditor general of the state, which explains itself. The letter is as follows: "In the matter of the appropriation of \$5,000 to your hospital, which has been referred to me, I would state the appropriation is operative under the law of 1897, providing you comply with the conditions. If your building is completed and ready to receive patients, all you need is to get a certificate from Cadwalader Bidle, Esq., chairman of the board of public charities, and send it to this department and we will issue the certificate to the proper person to receive it. Attend to this just as soon as possible, so that your appropriation will not lapse. I have just had a talk with the governor and will do all at this end of the line to assist you."
