## FESTIVAL FOR THE HOSPITAL

The strawberry and ice cream festival in Kleppinger's Hall held last evening under the auspices of the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Hospital Association proved a grand success. The two large rooms in the building were crowded with people to such an extent that it was almost impossible to serve all. However, it was a charitable crowd and a sort of a line was formed and as those satisfied with refreshments moved out others moved in to take their places.

One room was decorated in red and white and the other in cerise and white. There were two lemonade tables at which presided the members of the Ever Ready Circle of King's Daughters.
