REPPERT IS ALSO DEAD

Frederick A. Reppert died yesterday morning at 9.15 o'clock at the Allentown Hospital from the terrible injuries he inflicted upon himself, after strangling his wife on Saturday morning. Dr. Cawley visited Reppert at the hospital yesterday morning and spoke a few words to him. He examined his pulse and found it gradually growing weaker. Soon after this the patient began to sink and in an hour he expired. The body was removed by Undertaker Daubenspeck at noon to his morgue, where he embalmed it. The remains were taken on the 4.30 East Ponn train to Mertztown to the parents' home. The funeral will be held on Thursday at the Longswamp Church.

The funeral of Mrs. Reppert will be held to-morrow at 9.30 a. m. from the home of her parents, at Topton. Services will be held at Bower's Church by Rev. G. B. Smith.
